Page 186, line 19, strike “2017 and 2018” and insert “2017 through 2026”.

Page 186, line 23, strike “2018” and insert “2026”.

Page 186, line 25, strike “2018” and insert “2026”.

At the end of subtitle A of title VI, add the following new section:

1 **SEC. 6\_\_\_ . BASIC ALLOWANCE FOR HOUSING AND CERTAIN**  
2 **FEDERAL BENEFITS.**

3 (a) EXCLUSION OF BAH.—Section 403(k) of title 37,  
4 United States Code, is amended by adding at the end the  
5 following new paragraph:

6 “(4) In determining the eligibility to participate in  
7 the supplemental nutrition assistance program and the  
8 Family Subsistence Supplemental Allowance program the  
9 value of a housing allowance under this section shall be  
10 excluded from any calculation of income, assets, or re-  
11 sources.”.

1 (b) CONFORMING AMENDMENT.—Section 5(d) of the  
2 Food and Nutrition Act of 2008 (7 U.S.C. 2014(d)) is  
3 amended—

4 (1) in paragraph (18), by striking “; and” and  
5 inserting a semicolon;

6 (2) in paragraph (19)(B), by striking the period  
7 and inserting “; and”; and

8 (3) by adding at the end the following new  
9 paragraph:

10 “(20) allowance covered by section 403(k)(4) of  
11 title 37, United States Code.”.

At the end of subtitle B of title VII, add the fol-  
lowing new section:

12 **SEC. 7 \_\_\_\_. TRICARE PHARMACY PROGRAM COST-SHARING**  
13 **AMOUNTS.**

14 (a) COST-SHARING REQUIREMENTS.—Paragraph (6)  
15 of section 1074g(a) of title 10, United States Code, is  
16 amended to read as follows:

17 “(6)(A) Except as provided by subparagraph (C), in  
18 the case of any of calendar years 2017 through 2025, the  
19 cost-sharing requirements under the pharmacy benefits  
20 program shall be determined in accordance with the fol-  
21 lowing tables:

22 “(i) With respect to retail pharmacies:

3           “(B) Except as provided by subparagraph (C), in the  
4 case of any calendar year after 2025, the cost-sharing re-  
5 quirements under the pharmacy benefits program shall be  
6 calculated by adjusting the cost-sharing amounts in effect

1 for the previous year by an amount, if any, as determined  
2 by the Secretary to reflect changes in the costs of pharma-  
3 ceutical agents and prescription dispensing, rounded to  
4 the nearest dollar.

5 “(C)(i) With respect to a beneficiary described in  
6 clause (ii), the cost-sharing requirements under the phar-  
7 macy benefits program shall be equal to the cost-sharing  
8 requirements in effect on January 1, 2016.

9 “(ii) A beneficiary described in this clause is any of  
10 the following:

11 “(I) A dependent of a member of the uniformed  
12 services who dies while on active duty.

13 “(II) A member retired under chapter 61 of  
14 this title or a dependent of such a member.”.
