## AMENDMENT TO THE RULES COMMITTEE PRINT FOR H.R. 4435

## OFFERED BY MR. GOSAR OF ARIZONA

At the end of subtitle B of title XVIII, add the following new section:

## 1 SEC. 2817. REAL PROPERTY INVENTORY.

- 2 (a) Inventory.—The Secretary of Defense, in con-
- 3 sultation with other appropriate Federal agency officials,
- 4 shall develop and maintain a current, accurate, interoper-
- 5 able cadastral geographic information systems-based in-
- 6 ventory of Department of Defense buildings, land, and
- 7 other real property assets.
- 8 (b) In General.—In carrying out this section, the
- 9 Secretary shall—
- 10 (1) participate, pursuant to section 216 of the
- 11 E-Government Act of 2002 (Public Law 107–347;
- 12 44 U.S.C. 3501 note) in the establishment of such
- standards and common protocols as are necessary to
- assure the interoperability of geospatial information
- pertaining to the cadastre for all users of such infor-
- mation;
- 17 (2) coordinate with, seek assistance and co-
- operation of, and provide liaison to the Federal Geo-

1	graphic Data Committee pursuant to Office of Man-
2	agement and Budget Circular A-16 and Executive
3	Order 12906 for the implementation of and compli-
4	ance with such standards as may be applicable to
5	the cadastre;
6	(3) make the cadastre interoperable with the
7	Federal Real Property Profile established pursuant
8	to Executive Order 13327;
9	(4) integrate with and leverage to the maximum
10	extent practicable current cadastre activities of other
11	Federal agencies and units State and local govern-
12	ment; and
13	(5) use contracts with the private sector, to the
14	maximum extent practicable, to provide such prod-
15	ucts and services as are necessary to develop the ca-
16	dastre.
17	(c) Contracts Considered Surveying and Map-
18	PING.—Contracts entered into under subsection (b)(5)
19	shall be considered "surveying and mapping" services, as
20	such term is used and as such contracts are awarded in
21	accordance with the selection procedures in chapter 11 of
22	title 40, United States Code, and section 2855 of title 10,
23	United States Code. Such term shall include collecting,
24	storing, retrieving, or disseminating graphical or digital
25	data depicting natural or man-made physical features,

phenomena, or boundaries of the earth and any information related thereto, including surveys, maps, charts, sat-3 ellite and airborne remote sensing data, images, and services, with services performed by professionals such as surveyors, photogrammetrists, hydrographers, geodesists, 5 6 cartographers. 7 (d) Public Accessibility.—The Secretary shall 8 make the cadastre referred to in this section publicly available on the Internet in a graphically geo-enabled and 10 searchable format, except that the Secretary, in consultation with the Secretary of Homeland Security, shall pre-12 vent the disclosure of any parcel or parcels of land, and buildings or facilities thereon, or information related thereto, if such disclosure would impair or jeopardize the 14 15 national security or homeland defense of the United 16 States. 17 (e) Consolidation and Report.—Not later than 18 180 days after the date of the enactment of this Act, the 19 Secretary shall submit to the Committees on Armed Services of the House of Representatives and the Senate a re-20 21 port on— 22 (1) the existing real property inventories or any 23 components of any cadastre currently authorized by 24 law or conducted by the Department of Defense, the

2	Government for each such activity in fiscal year
3	2014;
4	(2) the existing real property inventories or any
5	components of any cadastre currently authorized by
6	law or conducted by the Department of Defense that
7	will be eliminated or consolidated into the multipur-
8	pose cadastre authorized by this section;
9	(3) the existing real property inventories or any
10	components of a cadastre currently authorized by
11	law or conducted by the Department of Defense that
12	will not be eliminated or consolidated into the multi-
13	purpose cadastre authorized by this Act, together
14	with a justification for not terminating or consoli-
15	dating such inventories or components in the multi-
16	purpose cadastre authorized by this section; and
17	(4) the cost-savings that will be achieved by
18	eliminating or consolidating duplicative or unneeded
19	real property inventories or any components of a ca-
20	dastre currently authorized by law or conducted by
21	the Department of Defense that will become part of
22	the multipurpose cadastre authorized by this section.
