

1 tation workers who also have a current Secret Level Clear-
2 ance issued by the Department of Defense shall be consid-
3 ered exempt from further vetting when seeking unescorted
4 access at Department of Defense facilities. Access security
5 personnel shall verify such person's security clearance in
6 a timely manner and provide them with unescorted access
7 to complete their freight service.

8 (c) REPORT ON CREDENTIALLED PERSONS DENIED
9 ACCESS TO DEPARTMENT OF DEFENSE INSTALLA-
10 TIONS.—Not later than 90 days after the date of enact-
11 ment of this Act, the Secretary of Defense shall begin doc-
12 umenting each instance when a credentialed transpor-
13 tation worker is denied unescorted access to a military fa-
14 cility in the Continental United States, Hawaii, Alaska,
15 or Native American lands. The report shall include, but
16 not be limited to, the reasons for such denial, and the
17 amount of time the credentialed party denied entrance
18 waited to obtain access. The report shall be submitted to
19 the Armed Services Committees of the House and Senate
20 no later than the first day of February of each year until
21 complete fielding of IMESA and electronic access control
22 systems are achieved.
