

**AMENDMENT TO H. CON. RES. 25**  
**OFFERED BY MS. JACKSON LEE OF TEXAS**

At the end of title VIII, add the following new section and conform the table of contents accordingly:

1 **SEC. \_\_\_\_ . SENSE OF THE HOUSE ON RESEARCH FOR TRI-**  
2 **PLE-NEGATIVE BREAST CANCER.**

3 It is the sense of the House that—

4 (1) no reductions should be made in funding  
5 made available to the National Institutes of Health  
6 for research with respect to a cure of triple-negative  
7 breast cancer; and

8 (2) if Congress wishes to reduce Federal spend-  
9 ing by a corresponding amount of any proposed re-  
10 duction of amounts made available for the purposes  
11 described in paragraph (1), such reduction should  
12 come from amounts made available for Overseas  
13 Contingency Operations/Global War on Terror.

Amend section 501 to read as follows:

14 **SEC. 501. DIRECT SPENDING.**

15 (a) MEANS-TESTED DIRECT SPENDING.—

16 (1) For means-tested direct spending, the aver-  
17 age rate of growth in the total level of outlays dur-

1       ing the 10-year period preceding fiscal year 2014 is  
2       6.7 percent.

3           (2) For means-tested direct spending, the esti-  
4       mated average rate of growth in the total level of  
5       outlays during the 10-year period beginning with fis-  
6       cal year 2014 is 6.2 percent under current law.

7           (3) This concurrent resolution retains the social  
8       safety net 21 that lifts millions of people out of pov-  
9       erty.

10       (b) NONMEANS-TESTED DIRECT SPENDING.—

11           (1) For nonmeans-tested direct spending, the  
12       average rate of growth in the total level of outlays  
13       during the 10-year period preceding fiscal year 2014  
14       is 5.9 percent.

15           (2) For nonmeans-tested direct spending, the  
16       estimated average rate of growth in the total level of  
17       outlays during the 10-year period beginning with fis-  
18       cal year 2014 is 5.3 percent under current law.

19           (3) This concurrent resolution does not make  
20       any reforms to nonmeans-tested programs.
