At the end of subtitle H of title XII, add the following new section:

1 SEC. 12_. REPORT ON MILITARY ACTION OF SAUDI ARABIA 2 AND ITS COALITIONS PARTNERS IN YEMEN.

3 (a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 180 days after the 4 date of the enactment of this Act, and every 180 days 5 thereafter, the Secretary of Defense and the Secretary of 6 State shall jointly submit the appropriate congressional 7 committees a report on military action of Saudi Arabia 8 and its coalitions partners in Yemen.

9 (b) MATTERS TO BE INCLUDED.—The report re10 quired by subsection (a) shall include a description of the
11 following:

(1) The extent to which the Government of
Saudi Arabia and its coalition partners in Yemen
are abiding by their "No Strike List and Restricted
Target List".

16 (2) Roles played by United States military per17 sonnel with respect to operations of such coalition
18 partners in Yemen.

11	(c) FORM.—The report required by subsection (a)
12	shall be submitted in unclassified form, but may contain
13	a classified annex.
14	(d) TERMINATION.—This section shall terminate
15	on—
16	(1) the date that is 2 years after the date of the
17	enactment of this Act, or
18	(2) the date on which the Secretary of Defense
19	and Secretary of State jointly certify to the appro-
20	priate congressional committees that the conflict in
21	Yemen has come to a conclusion,
22	whichever occurs earlier.
23	(e) Appropriate Congressional Committees De-
24	FINED.—In this section, the term "appropriate congres-
25	sional committees" means—

(1) the congressional defense committees; and

2 (2) the Committee on Foreign Relations of the

3 Senate and the Committee on Foreign Affairs of the

4 House of Representatives.
