Page 322, strike line 8 and insert the following:

1                   “(vii) support for school-based driver’s  
2                   education classes to improve teen knowl-  
3                   edge about—  
4                                 “(I) safe driving practices; and  
5                                 “(II) State’s graduated driving li-  
6                   cense requirements, including behind-  
7                   the-wheel training required to meet  
8                   those requirements; and”.

At the end of title IV of division A, insert the following:

9 **SEC. \_\_\_\_ . LICENSE SUSPENSION DATA COLLECTION PRO-**  
10 **GRAM.**

11         (a) **IN GENERAL.**—The Secretary shall conduct a  
12 program to gather data on an annual basis about State  
13 practices related to suspending driver’s licenses for non-  
14 driving related purposes.

15         (b) **CONTENTS.**—

1           (1) DATA TO BE COLLECTED.—The program  
2           shall include the collection of State specific data on  
3           the number of drivers who lose their driving privi-  
4           leges for reasons unrelated to driving behavior or  
5           violations of traffic laws, including, to the extent fea-  
6           sible—

7                   (A) demographic data on the drivers, in-  
8                   cluding age, sex, race, and ethnicity; and

9                   (B) information for—

10                           (i) each county within a State; and

11                           (ii) major metropolitan statistical  
12                   areas within a State.

13           (2) ASSESSMENT OF IMPACT OF STATE PRAC-  
14           TICES ON UNLICENSED DRIVING.—The program  
15           shall include undertaking research to assess the im-  
16           pact of the State practices referred to in subsection  
17           (a) on unlicensed driving.

18           (c) NON-DRIVING RELATED PURPOSES DEFINED.—  
19           In this section, the term “non-driving related purposes”  
20           means civil or administrative offenses that—

21                   (1) involve neither the operation of a motor ve-  
22                   hicle nor the knowledge, skills, or physical qualifica-  
23                   tions needed to operate a motor vehicle; and

24                   (2) are not related to traffic safety.

25           (d) REPORT.—

1           (1) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary shall use data  
2           collected under the program to provide a biennial re-  
3           port to Congress.

4           (2) CONTENTS.—The report shall include an  
5           assessment of—

6                   (A) how the State practices referred to in  
7                   subsection (a) affect the ability of drivers—

8                           (i) to get work; or

9                           (ii) to get to work or school;

10                   (B) how the State practices affect the abil-  
11                   ity of low-income young adults ages 16 through  
12                   24 to get or obtain a driver’s license; and

13                   (C) best practices used by States to miti-  
14                   gate the impact of the State practices on the  
15                   ability of individuals to get to work or school.

16           (3) AVAILABILITY.—The Secretary shall make  
17           the report publicly available on the Internet Web site  
18           of the Department.
