5	(a) FINDINGS.—Congress makes the following find-
6	ings:
7	(1) The Department of Defense has provided
8	critical support to U.S. Customs and Border Protec-
9	tion along the southwest border.
10	(2) The presence of the Department of Defense
11	along the southwest border has assisted U.S. Cus-
12	toms and Border Protection in deterring illegal
13	crossings at the southwest border.
14	(b) SENSE OF CONGRESS.—It is the sense of Con-
15	gress that—
16	(1) Department of Defense personnel have pro-
17	vided outstanding support to U.S. Customs and Bor-
18	der Protection along the southwest border; and

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(2) the Support of Civil Authority Mission of
 the Department has significantly contributed to
 mitigating the effects of the security challenges
 along the southwest border of the United States.

5 (c) QUARTERLY BRIEFINGS.—Not later than 30 days after the date of the enactment of this Act, and every 90 6 7 days thereafter through December 31, 2024, the Under 8 Secretary of Defense for Policy shall provide to the Com-9 mittee on Armed Services of the Senate and the Com-10 mittee on Armed Services of the House of Representatives 11 an unclassified briefing, with a classified component, if 12 necessary, regarding—

(1) Department of Defense planning to address
current and anticipated border support mission requirements as part of the annual planning, programming, budgeting, and execution process of the Department;

18 (2) the security situation along the southwest19 border of the United States;

20 (3) any Department of Defense efforts, or up21 dates to existing efforts, to cooperate with Mexico
22 with respect to border security;

(4) the type of support that is currently being
provided by the Department of Defense along the
southwest border of the United States;

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(5) the effect of such efforts and support on
 National Guard readiness;

3 (6) how a change in Department of Defense
4 policy would affect the ability of the Department to
5 provide such support; and

6 (7) any recommendations for whether the
7 southwest border mission of the Department of De8 fense should be expanded to respond to the security
9 situation referred to in paragraph (2).

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
