## Amendment to Rules Comm. Print 117–54 Offered by Mr. Malinowski of New Jersey

At the appropriate place in subtitle B of title XIII, insert the following:

## 1 SEC. \_\_\_\_. CONDITIONS ON MILITARY COOPERATION WITH 2 TUNISIAN MILITARY AND SECURITY SERV 3 ICES.

4 (a) DEFENSE COOPERATION.—Except as provided in
5 subsection (c), funds authorized to be appropriated pursu6 ant to section 333 of title 10, United States Code, may
7 not be made available for Tunisia until the date on which
8 the Secretary of Defense certifies to the appropriate con9 gressional committees that—

- 10 (1) Tunisia has ceased the use of military11 courts to try civilian defendants; and
- (2) no military personnel or assets are being
  used to prevent Tunisian legislators from accessing
  the Tunisian parliament building.

(b) SECURITY SERVICES.—The prohibition under
section 660(a) of the Foreign Assistance Act of 1961 (22
U.S.C. 2420(a)) shall apply with respect to Tunisia until
the date on which the Secretary of State certifies to the
appropriate congressional committees that Tunisian state

security forces under the authority of the Ministry of Inte rior have—

- 3 (1) taken concrete steps to prevent the use of
  4 excessive force against protesters and respect free5 dom of assembly;
- 6 (2) taken appropriate steps to investigate and
  7 punish past instances of excessive use of force
  8 against protesters; and
- 9 (3) ensured that such forces are not infringing
  10 upon the rights of Tunisians to free expression and
  11 assembly.
- 12 (c) EXCEPTIONS.—A certification described in sub-13 section (a) shall not be required with respect to funds au-14 thorized to be appropriated by this Act or otherwise made 15 available to the Department of Defense for programs in 16 Tunisia relating to border security, specifically at ports 17 of entry, or nonproliferation programs.
- (d) WAIVER.—The President may waive the certification requirements under subsections (a) and (b) with respect to specific assistance if, not later than 60 days before the assistance is to be provided, the President submits
  to the appropriate congressional committees a justification
  that the waiver is in the national security interest of the
  United States.

(e) APPROPRIATE CONGRESSIONAL COMMITTEES.—
 In this section, the term "appropriate congressional com mittees" means—

4 (1) the Committee on Armed Services and the
5 Committee on Foreign Relations of the Senate; and
6 (2) the Committee on Armed Services and the
7 Committee on Foreign Affairs of the House of Rep8 resentatives.

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
