

**AMENDMENT TO  
RULES COMMITTEE PRINT 117-15  
OFFERED BY MR. KAHELE OF HAWAII**

Page 7, strike lines 22 through 25, and insert the following:

1           “(9) NATIVE HAWAIIAN; NATIVE HAWAIIAN OR-  
2           GANIZATION.—The terms ‘Native Hawaiian’ and  
3           ‘Native Hawaiian organization’ have the meanings  
4           given such terms in section 6207 of the Native Ha-  
5           waiian Education Act (20 U.S.C. 7517).”.

Page 34, line 21, strike “10” and insert “11”,

Page 35, line 7, strike “population; and” and insert  
“population;”.

Page 35, line 7, after “Native population;” insert  
the following:

6           “(iv) a Native Hawaiian resource cen-  
7           ter on domestic violence, to reduce Native  
8           Hawaiian disparities; and

Page 45, after line 11, insert the following:

9           (F) by adding at the end the following:

1           “(5) NATIVE HAWAIIAN RESOURCE CENTER.—

2           In accordance with subsection (a)(2), the Secretary  
3           shall award a grant to an eligible entity for an Na-  
4           tive Hawaiian resource center on domestic violence  
5           to reduce Native Hawaiian disparities, which shall—

6                   “(A) offer a comprehensive array of tech-  
7                   nical assistance and training resources to Na-  
8                   tive Hawaiian organizations, specifically de-  
9                   signed to enhance the capacity of the Native  
10                  Hawaiian organizations to respond to family vi-  
11                  olence, domestic violence, and dating violence;

12                   “(B) coordinate all projects and other ac-  
13                   tivities with the national resource center de-  
14                   scribed in paragraph (1)(B);

15                   “(C) coordinate all projects and other ac-  
16                   tivities, with State and local governments, that  
17                   involve working with the State and local govern-  
18                   ments, to enhance their capacity to understand  
19                   the unique needs of Native Hawaiians;

20                   “(D) provide comprehensive community  
21                   education and prevention initiatives relating to  
22                   family violence, domestic violence, and dating  
23                   violence in a culturally sensitive and relevant  
24                   manner; and

1           “(E) coordinate activities with other Fed-  
2           eral agencies, offices, and grantees that address  
3           the needs of Native Hawaiians who experience  
4           family violence, domestic violence, and dating  
5           violence, including the Office for Victims of  
6           Crime and the Office on Violence Against  
7           Women of the Department of Justice.”; and

Page 49, line 16, strike “and”.

Page 50, line 7, strike the period and insert “; and”.

Page 50, after line 7, insert the following:

8           (G) by adding at the end the following:

9           “(6) NATIVE HAWAIIAN RESOURCE CENTER.—  
10          To be eligible to receive a grant under subsection  
11          (b)(3), an entity shall be a Native Hawaiian organi-  
12          zation, or a nonprofit private organization that fo-  
13          cuses primarily on issues of family violence, domestic  
14          violence, and dating violence within the Native Ha-  
15          waiian community, that submits information to the  
16          Secretary demonstrating—

17                 “(A) experience working with Native Ha-  
18                 waiian organizations to respond to family vio-  
19                 lence, domestic violence, and dating violence;

20                 “(B) experience providing Native Hawaiian  
21                 organizations with assistance in developing pre-

1           vention and intervention services addressing  
2           family violence, domestic violence, and dating  
3           violence and safety for Native Hawaiian women;

4                   “(C) strong support for the entity’s des-  
5           ignation as the Native Hawaiian resource cen-  
6           ter on domestic violence from advocates working  
7           with Native Hawaiian organizations to address  
8           family violence, domestic violence, and dating  
9           violence and the safety of Native Hawaiian  
10          women;

11                   “(D) a record of demonstrated effective-  
12          ness in assisting Native Hawaiian organizations  
13          with prevention and intervention services ad-  
14          dressing family violence, domestic violence, and  
15          dating violence; and

16                   “(E) the capacity to serve geographically  
17          diverse Native Hawaiian communities and orga-  
18          nizations.
