At the end of title LIII of division E of the bill, add the following:

1	SEC. 5306. CENTERS OF EXCELLENCE FOR DOMESTIC MARI-
2	TIME WORKFORCE TRAINING AND EDU-
3	CATION.
4	(a) In General.—Section 51706 of title 46, United
5	States Code, is amended—
6	(1) by striking subsection (a) and inserting the
7	following:
8	"(a) Designation.—The Secretary of Transpor-
9	tation may designate a covered training entity as a center
10	of excellence for domestic maritime workforce training and
11	education.";
12	(2) by striking subsection (b) and inserting the
13	following:
14	"(b) Grant Program.—

1	"(1) In General.—The Secretary may award
2	maritime career training grants to centers of excel-
3	lence designated under subsection (a) for the pur-
4	pose of developing, offering, or improving edu-
5	cational or career training programs for American
6	workers related to the United States maritime in-
7	dustry.
8	"(2) Required information.—To receive a
9	grant under this subsection, a center of excellence
10	designated under subsection (a) shall submit to the
11	Secretary a grant proposal that includes a detailed
12	description of—
13	"(A) the specific project for which the
14	grant proposal is submitted, including the man-
15	ner in which the grant will be used to develop,
16	offer, or improve an educational or career train-
17	ing program that is suited to United States
18	maritime industry workers;
19	"(B) the extent to which the project for
20	which the grant proposal is submitted will meet
21	the educational or career training needs of
22	United States maritime industry workers;
23	"(C) any previous experience of the center
24	of excellence in providing United States mari-

1	time industry educational or career training
2	programs;
3	"(D) how the grant would address short-
4	comings in existing educational and career
5	training opportunities available to United
6	States maritime industry workers; and
7	"(E) the extent to which employers, includ-
8	ing small and medium-sized firms, have dem-
9	onstrated a commitment to employing United
10	States maritime industry workers who would
11	benefit from the project for which the grant
12	proposal is submitted.
13	"(3) Criteria for award of grants.—Sub-
14	ject to the appropriation of funds, the Secretary
15	shall award a grant under this subsection based
16	on—
17	"(A) a determination of the merits of the
18	grant proposal submitted by the center of excel-
19	lence designated under subsection (a) to de-
20	velop, offer, or improve educational or career
21	training programs to be made available to
22	United States maritime industry workers;
23	"(B) an evaluation of the likely employ-
24	ment opportunities available to United States
25	maritime industry workers who complete a mar-

1	itime educational or career training program
2	that the center of excellence designated under
3	subsection (a) proposes to develop, offer, or im-
4	prove; and
5	"(C) an evaluation of prior demand for
6	training programs by workers served by the
7	centers of excellence designated under sub-
8	section (a) as well as the availability and capac-
9	ity of existing maritime training programs to
10	meet future demand for training programs.
11	"(4) Competitive Awards.—
12	"(A) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary shall
13	award grants under this subsection to a center
14	of excellence designated under subsection (a) on
15	a competitive basis.
16	"(B) TIMING OF GRANT NOTICE.—The
17	Secretary shall post a Notice of Funding Op-
18	portunity regarding grants awarded under this
19	subsection not more than 90 days after the date
20	of enactment of the appropriations Act for the
21	fiscal year concerned.
22	"(C) TIMING OF GRANTS.—The Secretary
23	shall award grants under this subsection not
24	later than 270 days after the date of the enact-

1	ment of the appropriations Act for the fiscal
2	year concerned.
3	"(D) Reuse of unexpended grant
4	FUNDS.—Notwithstanding subparagraph (C),
5	amounts awarded as a grant under this sub-
6	section that are not expended by the grantee
7	shall remain available to the Administrator for
8	use for grants under this subsection.
9	"(E) Administrative costs.—Not more
10	than 3 percent of amounts made available to
11	carry out this subsection may be used for the
12	necessary costs of grant administration.
13	"(F) Prohibited Use.—A center of excel-
14	lence designated under subsection (a) that has
15	received funds awarded under section
16	54101(a)(2) for training purposes shall not be
17	eligible for grants under this subsection in the
18	same fiscal year.
19	"(5) Authorization of appropriations.—
20	There is authorized to be appropriated to carry out
21	this subsection \$30,000,000."; and
22	(3) in subsection (c)—
23	(A) by striking paragraph (1) and insert-
24	ing the following:

1	"(1) COVERED TRAINING ENTITY.—The term
2	'covered training entity' means an entity that—
3	"(A) is located in a State that borders on
4	the—
5	"(i) Gulf of Mexico;
6	"(ii) Atlantic Ocean;
7	"(iii) Long Island Sound;
8	"(iv) Pacific Ocean;
9	"(v) Great Lakes; or
10	"(vi) Mississippi River System; and
11	"(B) is—
12	"(i) a postsecondary educational insti-
13	tution (as such term is defined in section
14	3 (39) of the Carl D. Perkins Career and
15	Technical Education Act of 2006 (20
16	U.S.C. 2302));
17	"(ii) a postsecondary vocational insti-
18	tution (as such term is defined in section
19	102(e) of the Higher Education Act of
20	1965 (20 U.S.C. 1002(e));
21	"(iii) a public or private nonprofit en-
22	tity that offers 1 or more other structured
23	experiential learning training programs for
24	American workers in the United States
25	maritime industry, including a program

1	that is offered by a labor organization or
2	conducted in partnership with a nonprofit
3	organization or 1 or more employers in the
4	United States maritime industry;
5	"(iv) an entity sponsoring an appren-
6	ticeship program registered with the Office
7	of Apprenticeship of the Employment and
8	Training Administration of the Depart-
9	ment of Labor or a State apprenticeship
10	agency recognized by the Office of Appren-
11	ticeship pursuant to the Act of August 16,
12	1937 (commonly known as the 'National
13	Apprenticeship Act'; 50 Stat. 664, chapter
14	663; 29 U.S.C. 50 et seq.); or
15	"(v) a maritime training center des-
16	ignated prior to the date of enactment of
17	the National Defense Authorization Act for
18	Fiscal Year 2023."; and
19	(B) by adding at the end the following:
20	"(3) Secretary.—The term 'Secretary' means
21	the Secretary of Transportation.
22	"(4) United states maritime industry.—
23	The term 'United States maritime industry' means
24	the design, construction, repair, operation, manning,
25	and supply of vessels in all segments of the maritime

1	transportation system of the United States, includ-
2	ing—
3	"(A) the domestic and foreign trade;
4	"(B) the coastal, offshore, and inland
5	trade, including energy activities conducted
6	under the Outer Continental Shelf Lands
7	Act(43 U.S.C. 1331 et seq.);
8	"(C) non-commercial maritime activities,
9	including—
10	"(i) recreational boating; and
11	"(ii) oceanographic and limnological
12	research as described in section
13	2101(24).".
14	(b) Public Report.—Not later than December 15
15	in each of calendar years 2022 through 2024, the Sec-
16	retary of Transportation shall make available on a publicly
17	available website a report and provide a briefing to the
18	Committee on Commerce, Science, and Transportation of
19	the Senate and the Committee on Transportation and In-
20	frastructure of the House of Representatives—
21	(1) describing each grant awarded under this
22	subsection during the preceding fiscal year; and
23	(2) assessing the impact of each award of a
24	grant under this subsection in a fiscal year pre-

1	ceding the fiscal year referred to in subparagraph
2	(A) on workers receiving training.
3	(c) Guidelines.—Not later than 1 year after the
4	date of enactment of this Act, the Secretary shall—
5	(1) promulgate guidelines for the submission of
6	grant proposals under section 51706(b) of title 46,
7	United States Code (as amended by this section);
8	and
9	(2) publish and maintain such guidelines on the
10	website of the Department of Transportation.
11	(d) Assistance for Small Shipyards.—Section
12	54101(e) of title 46, United States Code, is amended by
13	striking paragraph (2) and inserting the following:
14	"(2) Allocation of funds.—
15	"(A) IN GENERAL.—The Administrator
16	may not award more than 25 percent of the
17	funds appropriated to carry out this section for
18	any fiscal year to any small shipyard in one ge-
19	ographic location that has more than 600 em-
20	ployees.
21	"(B) Ineligibility.—A maritime training
22	center that has received funds awarded under
23	this section 51706 of title 46, United States
24	Code, shall not be eligible for grants under this

- 2 fiscal year.".
