

**AMENDMENT TO H.R. 4641, AS REPORTED
OFFERED BY MS. CLARK OF MASSACHUSETTS**

At the end of the bill, add the following:

1 **SEC. 2. REAUTHORIZATION OF EARLY INTERVENTION**
2 **SERVICES FOR CHILDREN AND ADOLES-**
3 **CENTS.**

4 Section 514A of the Public Health Service Act (42
5 U.S.C. 290bb–8) is amended—

6 (1) by striking “abuse” and inserting “use”
7 each place it appears; and

8 (2) in subsection (g), by striking “for fiscal
9 years 2002 and 2003” and inserting “for each of
10 fiscal years 2017 through 2022”.

11 **SEC. 3. SCHOOL-BASED SUBSTANCE USE SCREENING AND**
12 **INTERVENTION DEMONSTRATION PROGRAM.**

13 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary of Health and
14 Human Services (in this section referred to as the “Sec-
15 retary”) shall award grants to States and, in consultation
16 with State health authorities, political subdivisions of
17 States (including local educational agencies) to conduct
18 demonstration programs—

19 (1) to evaluate the effectiveness of conducting
20 substance use and substance use disorder screening,

1 intervention, and referral to treatment services in
2 schools; and

3 (2) to identify barriers to the implementation
4 and effectiveness of such services in schools, includ-
5 ing issues related to associated costs, privacy protec-
6 tions, and the availability of appropriately trained
7 professionals able to provide such services.

8 (b) APPLICATION.—To seek a grant under this sec-
9 tion, an applicant shall submit to the Secretary an applica-
10 tion at such time, in such manner, and containing such
11 information as the Secretary may require.

12 (c) REPORT.—Not later than 2 years after the date
13 of enactment of this section, the Secretary shall submit
14 to the Committee on Health, Education, Labor, and Pen-
15 sions of the Senate, and the Committee on Education and
16 the Workforce and the Committee on Energy and Com-
17 merce of the House of Representatives a report that—

18 (1) describes the specific programs established
19 under this section;

20 (2) evaluates the effectiveness of such pro-
21 grams; and

22 (3) provides recommendations for the imple-
23 mentation, expansion, and support of effective
24 school-based screening, brief intervention, and refer-
25 ral to treatment services.

1 (d) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—There is
2 authorized to be appropriated such sums as may be nec-
3 essary to carry out this section.
