SEC. 1824. STRATEGY ON UNITED STATE EXPORTS OF TELE COMMUNICATIONS INFRASTRUCTURE. (a) SENSE OF CONGRESS.—It is the sense of Con gress that— (1) the People's Republic of China's tele-

(2) the People's Republic of China's dominance
across the African continent in providing telecommunications equipment given reports that telecommunications equipment could be used to spy on,
intercept, or shut down sensitive communications,
including by American personnel in country;
