

AMENDMENT TO H.R. 1
OFFERED BY MR. ARRINGTON OF TEXAS

Page 20, line 14, strike “Section 3” and insert the following:

1 (a) FINDINGS.—Congress finds the following:

2 (1) In 2022, the United States became the larg-
3 est liquified natural gas exporter in the world and
4 will remain a net exporter of natural gas through
5 2050, driven by increasing global demand.

6 (2) Expanded domestic liquefied natural gas
7 production and exports increased the energy security
8 of the United States and its allies as the Russia-
9 Ukraine war disrupted global economies and energy
10 markets.

11 (3) Expanded domestic natural gas production
12 and exports contributed to reducing global green-
13 house gas emissions.

14 (4) On March 25, 2022, the United States and
15 the European Union found that an increase in sup-
16 ply of liquified natural gas from the United States
17 would be critical to reducing reliance on Russian gas
18 supply and reducing global greenhouse gas emis-
19 sions.

1 (b) SENSE OF CONGRESS.—It is the sense of Con-
2 gress that—

3 (1) the United States has economic, national
4 security, and domestic interests in the exportation of
5 domestic liquified natural gas to global markets in
6 a way that benefits the energy security of allies and
7 partners in light of global threats and challenges;

8 (2) the United States reaffirms its commitment
9 to reducing barriers to increasing liquified natural
10 gas supply and encouraging the development of en-
11 ergy infrastructure and accessible, transparent, and
12 competitive energy markets that provide diversified
13 sources, types, and routes of energy to enhance en-
14 ergy security and reduce global greenhouse gas emis-
15 sions; and

16 (3) the Federal government should not impose
17 overly restrictive regulations to discourage invest-
18 ments in all segments of liquefied natural gas supply
19 chains.
