

**AMENDMENT TO H.R. 8595, AS REPORTED
OFFERED BY MS. ANSARI OF ARIZONA**

At the end of the bill (before the short title), insert
the following:

SEC. ____. REPORT ON NATIONAL SECURITY IMPLICATIONS OF CERTAIN FOREIGN GIFTS AND INVESTMENTS.

(a) Report Required.—Not later than 60 days after the date of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary of State, in consultation with the Director of National Intelligence and the Secretary of Defense, shall submit to Congress a comprehensive report on the national security, counterintelligence, foreign policy, and legal implications of certain foreign gifts and investments involving high-level executive branch officials, their families, and close associates.

(b) Matters to be Included.—The report required under subsection (a) shall include a detailed assessment of the following:

- (1) Qatari Aircraft Gift.—
 - (A) The national security, operational, and cyber-vulnerability risks associated with the acceptance, retrofitting, and utilization of the \$400,000,000 Boeing 747-8 aircraft gifted or transferred by the Government of Qatar or the Qatari royal family for use by President Donald J. Trump.
 - (B) An evaluation of any potential intelligence-gathering capabilities or compromise of presidential communications security arising from foreign custody of the aircraft prior to transfer.
 - (C) Any diplomatic or policy concessions discussed or enacted in connection with the acceptance of the aircraft.
- (2) Emirati Investments (2025–2026).—All capital investments, equity acquisitions, joint ventures, and financial transactions made by citizens, nationals, sovereign wealth funds, or state-backed corporate entities of the United Arab Emirates (UAE) between January 20, 2025, and the date of enactment of this Act, in business ventures or entities owned, operated, or controlled by:
 - (A) President Donald J. Trump or any entity under the umbrella of the Trump Organization.
 - (B) Trump family members, spouses, and relations, including:
 - (i) Melania Trump;
 - (ii) Donald J. Trump Jr. and Bettina Anderson;
 - (iii) Eric Trump and Lara Trump;
 - (iv) Ivanka Trump and Jared Kushner;
 - (v) Tiffany Trump and Michael Boulos;
 - (vi) Barron Trump; and
 - (vii) Kimberly Guilfoyle.
 - (C) Kushner family members, including Charles Kushner, and associates at Affinity Partners.

- (D) Witkoff family members, including Steve Witkoff, Zachary Witkoff, and Alex Witkoff, or associated entities, including but not limited to World Liberty Financial or related digital asset enterprises.
- (3) Policy Impact Assessment.—Whether any financial transaction or gift identified under paragraphs (1) or (2) correlated with or influenced specific U.S. foreign policy shifts, export control exemptions (including the transfer of advanced technology or artificial intelligence hardware), or diplomatic mediation frameworks in the Middle East during the 2025–2026 period.
- (4) Constitutional and Emoluments Compliance Analysis.—A detailed legal assessment by the Attorney General, in coordination with the Office of Legal Counsel, determining:
 - (A) Whether the acceptance, utilization, or financial benefit derived from the aircraft described in paragraph (1), or the commercial investments described in paragraph (2), constitute a violation of the Foreign Emoluments Clause (Article I, Section 9, Clause 8 of the Constitution of the United States) by receiving a present, emolument, office, or title of any kind whatever from a foreign state without the express consent of Congress.
 - (B) Whether any transactions identified under paragraph (2) involving entities owned or controlled by President Donald J. Trump violate the Domestic Emoluments Clause (Article II, Section 1, Clause 7 of the Constitution of the United States).
 - (C) A list of any specific actions taken by the executive branch to seek congressional consent for the receipt of such gifts or emoluments, or any internal mechanisms established to divest or sequester foreign state-derived revenues to ensure constitutional compliance.

(c) Form.—The report required by subsection (a) shall be submitted in unclassified form, but may include a classified annex if necessary to protect sensitive intelligence sources and methods.
