

**AMENDMENT TO RULES COMMITTEE PRINT 119-8**  
**OFFERED BY MR. BACON OF NEBRASKA**

At the end of subtitle E of title X, add the following  
new section:

**1 SEC. 10\_\_\_\_. REPORT ON DRONE WARFARE LESSONS**  
**2 LEARNED AND OPPORTUNITIES FOR CO-PRO-**  
**3 Duction.**

**4** (a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than July 1, 2026, the  
**5** Secretary of Defense shall submit to the appropriate con-  
**6** gressional committees a report on lessons learned from  
**7** drone warfare in Ukraine, with a particular focus on les-  
**8** sons learned regarding—

**9** (1) the co-production of unmanned aerial sys-  
**10** tems and counter-UAS technologies and systems (re-  
**11** ferred to in this section as “UAS and counter-UAS  
**12** technologies and systems”); and

**13** (2) how such lessons may be applied to enhance  
**14** and expand the capacity of the United States to co-  
**15** produce such technologies and systems in partner-  
**16** ship with other nations.

**17** (b) ELEMENTS.—The report shall include the fol-  
**18** lowing:

1           (1) Identification of lessons learned from the  
2           research and development, production, fielding, and  
3           operations of UAS and counter-UAS technologies  
4           and systems in Ukraine and an analysis of how  
5           those lessons learned can strengthen the United  
6           States industrial base.

7           (2) An explanation of any steps that have been  
8           taken to streamline relevant export or licensing pro-  
9           cedures for such technologies and systems.

10          (3) A description of any barriers to the ability  
11          of the United States, United States companies, and  
12          other nations to co-produce such technologies and  
13          systems and recommendations for solutions to ad-  
14          dress such barriers.

15          (4) Recommendations for enhancing opportuni-  
16          ties for United States software companies to work  
17          with companies that produce such technologies and  
18          systems in other nations.

19          (5) Potential risks and risk mitigation strate-  
20          gies relating to supply chain security for UAS and  
21          counter-UAS technologies and systems that are co-  
22          produced by the United States, United States com-  
23          panies, and other nations.

1           (c) APPROPRIATE CONGRESSIONAL COMMITTEES DE-  
2 FINED.—In this section, the term “appropriate congres-  
3 sional committees” means—

4           (1) the Committee on Armed Services and the  
5           Committee on Foreign Affairs of the House of Rep-  
6           resentatives; and

7           (2) the Committee on Armed Services and the  
8           Committee on Foreign Relations of the Senate.
