At the appropriate place in title LVIII, insert the following:

## 1 SEC. \_\_\_\_\_. SANCTIONS WITH RESPECT TO COMMUNIST CHI 2 NESE MILITARY AND SURVEILLANCE COMPA 3 NIES.

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 180 days after the
5 date on which the first updated list is submitted under
6 section 1260H of the William M. (Mac) Thornberry Na7 tional Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2021 (10
8 U.S.C. 113 note) on or after the date of the enactment
9 of this Act, the President shall impose the sanctions de10 scribed in subsection (b) with respect to—

11 (1) each person that is on such updated list,12 and

(2) each foreign person listed in the Annex to
Executive Order 14032 (86 Fed. Reg. 30145; relating to addressing the threat from securities investments that finance certain companies of the People's
Republic of China) of June 3, 2021, or determined
by the Secretary of the Treasury, in consultation
with the Secretary of State, and, as the Secretary of

the Treasury determines appropriate, the Secretary
 of Defense, to engage in the activities described
 under section 1(a)(i) or 1(a)(ii) of such Executive
 Order 14032,

5 if the President determines that the imposition of such
6 sanctions meets appropriate evidentiary standards and ad7 vances the objective of resolving the national emergency
8 described in Executive Order 14032 (86 Fed. Reg. 30145;
9 relating to addressing the threat from securities invest10 ments that finance certain companies of the People's Re11 public of China) of June 3, 2021.

12 (b) SANCTIONS DESCRIBED.—The President shall ex-13 ercise all of the powers granted to the President under 14 the International Emergency Economic Powers Act (50 15 U.S.C. 1701 et seq.) to the extent necessary to block and 16 prohibit all transactions in property and interests in prop-17 erty of a person if such property and interests in prop-18 erty—

- 19 (1) are in the United States;
- 20 (2) come within the United States; or
- 21 (3) come within the possession or control of a22 United States person.

23 (c) PENALTIES.—The penalties set forth in section
24 206 of the International Emergency Economic Powers Act

(50 U.S.C. 1705) apply to violations of any license, order,
 or regulation issued under this section.

3 (d) WAIVER.—The President may waive the applica4 tion of sanctions under this section if the President cer5 tifies in writing to the appropriate congressional commit6 tees that the waiver is in the national interest of the
7 United States, with an explanation of the reasons therefor.
8 (e) EXCEPTION FOR INTELLIGENCE ACTIVITIES.—

9 Sanctions under this section shall not apply to any activity
10 subject to the reporting requirements under title V of the
11 National Security Act of 1947 (50 U.S.C. 3091 et seq.)
12 or any authorized intelligence activities of the United
13 States.

14 (f) EXCEPTION RELATING TO IMPORTATION OF15 GOODS.—

16 (1) IN GENERAL.—The authorities and require17 ments to impose sanctions authorized under this sec18 tion shall not include the authority or requirement
19 to impose sanctions on the importation of goods.

20 (2) GOOD DEFINED.—In this subsection, the
21 term "good" means any article, natural or manmade
22 substance, material, supply, or manufactured prod23 uct, including inspection and test equipment, and ex24 cluding technical data.

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(g) CONFORMING REQUIREMENT.—Not later than
 180 days after the date of the enactment of this Act, the
 President shall revoke the prohibitions described in section
 1(a) of Executive Order 14032 (86 that are duplicative
 of, less restrictive than, or are otherwise made redundant
 by, the sanctions described in this section.

7 (h) APPROPRIATE CONGRESSIONAL COMMITTEES
8 DEFINED.—In this section, the term "appropriate con9 gressional committees" means—

10 (1) the Committee on Foreign Affairs and the
11 Committee on Financial Services of the House of
12 Representatives; and

(2) the Committee on Foreign Relations and
the Committee on Banking, Housing, and Urban Affairs of the Senate.

16 (i) SUNSET.—The authority to impose sanctions
17 under this section, and any sanctions imposed under this
18 section, shall terminate on the earlier of—

(1) the date that is 30 days after the date on
which the President repeals the national emergency
declared under Executive Order 13959 (85 Fed.
Reg. 73185); or

(2) the date that is 7 years after the date of theenactment of this Act.

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
