1 SEC. ____. STATEMENT OF POLICY AND REPORT ON ENGAG 2 ING WITH NIGER.

3 (a) STATEMENT OF POLICY.—It is the policy of the
4 United States to—

5 (1) continue to support Niger's efforts to ad6 vance democracy, good governance, human rights,
7 and regional security within its borders through bi8 lateral assistance and multilateral initiatives;

9 (2) enhance engagement and cooperation with 10 the Nigerien government at all levels as a key com-11 ponent of stabilizing the Sahel, where frequent coups 12 and other anti-democratic movements, food insecu-13 rity, violent extremism, and armed conflict threaten 14 to further weaken governments throughout the re-15 gion; and

16 (3) work closely with partners and allies
17 throughout the international community to elevate
18 Niger, which experienced its first democratic transi19 tion of power in 2021, as an example of

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transitioning from longstanding military governance
 and a cycle of coups to a democratic, civilian-led
 form of government.

(b) REPORT REQUIRED.—Not later than 180 days 4 after the date of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary 5 of State, in consultation with the heads of relevant depart-6 7 ments and agencies, shall submit to the appropriate con-8 gressional committees a report on interagency efforts to 9 enhance United States engagement with Niger as a key 10 component of the United States Strategy toward the 11 Sahel. Such report shall also include the following information with respect to the 2 fiscal years preceding the 12 date of the submission of the report: 13

(1) A description of United States efforts to
promote democracy, political pluralism, fiscal transparency and other good governance initiatives,
human rights and the rule of law, and a robust and
engaged civil society.

19 (2) A full, detailed breakdown of United States 20 assistance provided to help the Nigerien Government 21 develop a comprehensive national security strategy, 22 including to counter terrorism, regional and 23 transnational organized crime, intercommunal vio-24 lence, and other forms of armed conflict, criminal

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1	activity, and other threats to United States and
2	Nigerien national security.
3	(3) An analysis of relevant resources at United
4	States Embassy Niamey, including whether staff in
5	place by the end of the current fiscal year will be
6	sufficient to meet various country and regional stra-
7	tegic objectives.
8	(4) An overview of foreign partner support for
9	Niger's intelligence and security sector.
10	(5) A detailed description of United States and
11	international efforts to address food insecurity in
12	Niger, including that which is caused by deforest-
13	ation, desertification, and other climate change-re-
14	lated issues.
15	(6) A breakdown of United States funds obli-
16	gated for humanitarian assistance in Niger, and an
17	analysis of how the security situation in Niger has
18	affected humanitarian operations and diplomatic en-
19	gagement throughout the country.
20	(7) An assessment of foreign malign influence
21	in Niger, with a specific focus on the People's Re-
22	public of China, the Russian Federation, and their
23	proxies.

(c) FORM.—The report required by section (b) shall
 be submitted in unclassified form and may include a classified annex.

4 (d) APPROPRIATE CONGRESSIONAL COMMITTEES.—
5 In this section, the term "appropriate congressional com6 mittees" means—

7 (1) the Committee on Foreign Affairs and the
8 Committee on Financial Services of the House of
9 Representatives; and

10 (2) the Committee on Foreign Relations and
11 the Committee on Banking, Housing, and Urban Af12 fairs of the Senate.

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
