

(a) **Sense of Congress.**—It is the sense of Congress that—

1. the Department of the Air Force should prioritize investments that enable Multi-Domain Operations (MDO) capabilities in support of next-generation warfare concepts;
2. Beale Air Force Base, California, is strategically positioned to support advanced intelligence, surveillance, reconnaissance, and emerging autonomous and collaborative combat capabilities; and
3. modernized infrastructure is required to support programs such as the Collaborative Combat Aircraft (CCA) initiative and other advanced operational concepts.

(b) **Directive to Prioritize Use of Funds.**—The Secretary of the Air Force shall, to the maximum extent practicable, prioritize the use of available and authorized funds to support the development of a Multi-Domain Operations Complex (MDOC) at Beale Air Force Base, California.

(c) **Use of Authorized Funds.**—In carrying out subsection (b), the Secretary may utilize funds—

1. authorized to be appropriated for military construction (MILCON), where appropriate;
2. available within operations and maintenance accounts for planning, design, and minor construction; and
3. from any other authorized accounts, consistent with applicable reprogramming and transfer authorities.

(d) **Scope of Activities.**—Funds prioritized under this section may be used for—

1. modernization and expansion of facilities to support Multi-Domain Operations;
2. infrastructure improvements necessary to enable integration of advanced air, space, cyber, and autonomous systems;
3. construction or modification of facilities to support the Collaborative Combat Aircraft program and related initiatives; and
4. associated planning, design, and sustainment activities.

(e) **Report to Congress.**—Not later than 180 days after the date of enactment of this Act, the Secretary of the Air Force shall submit to the congressional defense committees a report that includes—

1. a description of planned investments in Multi-Domain Operations Complex capabilities at Beale Air Force Base;
2. a summary of funding sources and timelines for such investments; and
3. an assessment of how such investments support next-generation defense initiatives, including the Collaborative Combat Aircraft program.

(f) **Rule of Construction.**—Nothing in this section shall be construed to require additional appropriations or to supersede existing statutory requirements related to military construction or reprogramming of funds.
