

AMENDMENT TO H.R. 5103, AS REPORTED
OFFERED BY MR. BELL OF MISSOURI

Strike all after the enacting clause and insert the following:

1 **SECTION 1. OMNIBUS FEDERAL PAYMENT FOR VARIOUS**
2 **INITIATIVES.**

3 There is authorized to be appropriated to the District
4 of Columbia \$1,436,000,000, to be allocated and used as
5 follows:

6 (1) \$143,600,000 of such amount shall be used
7 for programs to expand access to health care.

8 (2) \$143,600,000 of such amount shall be used
9 for programs to reduce homelessness.

10 (3) \$143,600,000 of such amount shall be used
11 for programs to provide food assistance for the
12 needy.

13 (4) \$143,600,000 of such amount shall be used
14 for programs to provide services for victims of crime.

15 (5) \$143,600,000 of such amount shall be used
16 for youth programs.

17 (6) \$143,600,000 of such amount shall be used
18 for community violence intervention programs.

1 (7) \$143,600,000 of such amount shall be used
2 for drug treatment programs.

3 (8) \$143,600,000 of such amount shall be used
4 for programs to provide mental health services.

5 (9) \$143,600,000 of such amount shall be used
6 for programs to prevent gun violence.

7 (10) \$143,600,000 of such amount shall be
8 used by the Office of Unified Communications for
9 improvements to 911 service.

10 **SEC. 2. OTHER FEDERAL PAYMENTS TO DISTRICT OF CO-**
11 **LUMBIA.**

12 (a) METROPOLITAN POLICE DEPARTMENT.—There
13 is authorized to be appropriated to the District of Colum-
14 bia \$100,000,000, to be used by the Chief of the Metro-
15 politan Police Department to recruit, appoint, and train
16 additional officers.

17 (b) EMERGENCY PLANNING AND SECURITY.—There
18 is authorized to be appropriated to the Mayor of the Dis-
19 trict of Columbia \$100,000,000, to be used to pay nec-
20 essary expenses, as determined by the Mayor in written
21 consultation with the elected county or city officials of sur-
22 rounding jurisdictions, for the costs of providing public
23 safety at events related to the presence of the National
24 Capital in the District of Columbia, including support re-
25 quested by the Director of the United States Secret Serv-

1 ice in carrying out protective duties under the direction
2 of the Secretary of Homeland Security, and for the costs
3 of providing support to respond to immediate and specific
4 terrorist threats or attacks in the District of Columbia or
5 surrounding jurisdictions.

6 (c) **CRIMINAL JUSTICE COORDINATING COUNCIL.**—
7 There is authorized to be appropriated to the Criminal
8 Justice Coordinating Council \$6,000,000, to be used to
9 support initiatives related to the coordination of Federal
10 and local criminal justice resources in the District of Co-
11 lumbia.

12 **SEC. 3. OTHER PAYMENTS TO SUPPORT DISTRICT OF CO-**
13 **LUMBIA.**

14 (a) **PROSECUTORS.**—There is authorized to be appro-
15 priated to the Attorney General of the United States
16 \$50,000,000, to be used to recruit, appoint, and train ad-
17 ditional prosecutors and investigators for the Office of the
18 United States Attorney for the District of Columbia.

19 (b) **PARKS AND ROADS.**—There is authorized to be
20 appropriated \$284,000,000 for improving parks and roads
21 in the District of Columbia, of which—

22 (1) 50 percent shall be available for the Direc-
23 tor of the National Park Service; and

24 (2) 50 percent shall be available for the Mayor
25 of the District of Columbia.

1 **SEC. 4. CONTINUING AVAILABILITY OF FUNDS.**

- 2 Amounts appropriated pursuant to the authorizations
3 under this Act shall remain available until expended.

Amend the title so as to read: “A bill to authorize appropriations to make the District of Columbia safer and more beautiful, and for other purposes.”.
