1	SEC. 318. CENTERS OF EXCELLENCE IN PREVENTION, DIAG-
2	NOSIS, MITIGATION, TREATMENT, AND REHA-
3	BILITATION OF HEALTH CONDITIONS RELAT-
4	ING TO EXPOSURE TO OPEN BURN PITS AND
5	OTHER EXPOSURE TO OPEN BURN PITS AND
6	OTHER ENVIRONMENTAL EXPOSURES.
7	(a) Establishment.—The Secretary of Defense
8	shall establish within the Department of Defense three
9	centers of excellence in the prevention, diagnosis, mitiga-
10	tion, treatment, and rehabilitation of health conditions re-
11	lating to exposure to open burn pits and other environ-
12	mental exposures to carry out the responsibilities specified
13	in subsection (c). Such centers shall be established
14	using—
15	(1) the directives, policies, and Comptroller
16	General and Inspector General recommendations in
17	effect as of the date of the enactment of this Act;
18	and

1	(2) guidance issued pursuant to section 313 of
2	the National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal
3	Year 2013 (Public Law 112–239; 126 Stat. 1692;
4	10 U.S.C. 1074 note).
5	(b) Selection of Sites.—In selecting sites for the
6	centers of excellence under subsection (a), the Secretary
7	of Defense shall select entities that—
8	(1) are equipped with the specialized equipment
9	needed to study, diagnose, and treat health condi-
10	tions relating to exposure to open burn pits and
11	other environmental exposures;
12	(2) have a publication track record of post-de-
13	ployment health exposures among veterans from
14	Iraq and Afghanistan;
15	(3) have collaborated with a geosciences depart-
16	ment that has a medical geology division;
17	(4) have developed animal models and in vitro
18	models of dust immunology and lung injury from
19	Iraq and Afghanistan; and
20	(5) have expertise in allergy and immunology,
21	pulmonary diseases, and industrial and management
22	engineering.
23	(c) Partnerships.—The Secretary shall ensure that
24	the centers collaborate to the maximum extent practicable
25	with the Secretary of Veterans Affairs, institutions of

higher education, and other appropriate public and private 2 entities (including international entities) to carry out the 3 responsibilities specified in subsection (d). 4 (d) Responsibilities.—The center shall have re-5 sponsibilities as follows: 6 (1) To implement the comprehensive plan and 7 strategy for the Department of Defense for the pre-8 vention, diagnosis, mitigation, treatment, and reha-9 bilitation of health conditions relating to exposure to 10 open burn pits and other environmental exposures. 11 (2) To provide for the development, testing, and 12 dissemination within the Department of best prac-13 tices for the treatment of health conditions relating 14 to exposure to open burn pits and other environ-15 mental exposures. 16 (3) To provide guidance for the health system 17 of the Department in determining the personnel re-18 quired to provide quality health care for members of 19 the Armed Forces with health conditions relating to 20 exposure to open burn pits and other environmental 21 exposures. 22 (4) To establish, implement, and oversee a com-23 prehensive program to train health professionals of 24 the Department in the treatment of health condi-

1	tions relating to exposure to open burn pits and
2	other environmental exposures.
3	(5) To facilitate advancements in the study of
4	the short-term and long-term effects of exposure to
5	open burn pits and other environmental exposures.
6	(6) To disseminate within the military medical
7	treatment facilities of the Department best practices
8	for training health professionals with respect to
9	health conditions relating to exposure to open burn
10	pits and other environmental exposures.
11	(7) To conduct basic science and translational
12	research on health conditions relating to exposure to
13	open burn pits and other environmental exposures
14	for the purposes of understanding the etiology of
15	such conditions and developing preventive interven-
16	tions and new treatments.
17	(8) To provide medical treatment to all veterans
18	identified as part of the burn pits registry estab-
19	lished under section 201 of the Dignified Burial and
20	Other Veterans' Benefits Improvement Act of 2012
21	(Public Law 112–260; 38 U.S.C. 527 note).
22	(e) USE OF BURN PITS REGISTRY DATA.—In car-
23	rying out its responsibilities under subsection (c), the cen-
24	ter shall have access to and make use of the data accumu-
25	lated by the burn pits registry established under section

1	201 of the Dignified Burial and Other Veterans' Benefits
2	Improvement Act of 2012 (Public Law 112–260; 38
3	U.S.C. 527 note).
4	(f) Definitions.—In this section:
5	(1) The term "open burn pit" means an area
6	of land located in Afghanistan or Iraq that—
7	(A) is designated by the Secretary of De-
8	fense to be used for disposing solid waste by
9	burning in the outdoor air; and
10	(B) does not contain a commercially manu-
11	factured incinerator or other equipment specifi-
12	cally designed and manufactured for the burn-
13	ing of solid waste.
14	(2) The term "other environmental exposures"
15	means exposure to environmental hazards, including
16	burn pits, dust or sand, hazardous materials, and
17	waste at any site in Afghanistan or Iraq that emits
18	smoke containing pollutants present in the environ-
19	ment or smoke from fires or explosions.
20	(g) Authorization of Appropriations.—There is
21	authorized to be appropriated to carry out this section
22	\$30,000,000 for fiscal year 2015.
