

AMENDMENT TO H.R. 3746
OFFERED BY MR. BRECHEEN OF OKLAHOMA

Page 61, strike line 18 and all that follows through
page 67, line 12, and insert the following:

1 **SEC. 301. RECALIBRATION OF THE CASELOAD REDUCTION**
2 **CREDIT.**

3 Section 407(b)(3) of the Social Security Act (42
4 U.S.C. 607(b)(3)) is amended in each of subparagraphs
5 (A)(ii) and (B), by striking “2005” and inserting “2022”.

6 **SEC. 302. ELIMINATING EXCESS MAINTENANCE OF EFFORT**
7 **SPENDING IN DETERMINING CASELOAD RE-**
8 **DUCTION CREDIT.**

9 Section 407(b)(3) of the Social Security Act (42
10 U.S.C. 607(b)(3)) is amended by adding at the end the
11 following:

12 “(C) EXCLUSION OF CERTAIN CASES.—
13 The Secretary shall determine the minimum
14 participation rate of a State for a fiscal year
15 under this subsection without regard to cases
16 that are funded by an amount expended in ex-
17 cess of the applicable percentage of the historic
18 expenditures (as defined in section

1 409(a)(7)(B)(ii) of the State for the fiscal
2 year.”.

3 **SEC. 303. ELIMINATION OF SMALL CHECKS SCHEME.**

4 Section 407(b) of the Social Security Act (42 U.S.C.
5 607(b)) is amended by adding at the end the following:

6 “(6) SPECIAL RULE REGARDING CALCULATION
7 OF THE MINIMUM PARTICIPATION RATE.—The Sec-
8 retary shall determine participation rates under this
9 section without regard to any individual engaged in
10 work who is described in section 408(a)(2), who is
11 not in compliance with section 408(a)(3), or with re-
12 spect to whom the assessment required by section
13 408(b)(1) has not been made.”.

14 **SEC. 304. REPORTING OF WORK OUTCOMES.**

15 Section 411 of the Social Security Act (42 U.S.C.
16 611) is amended by adding at the end the following:

17 “(e) REPORTING PERFORMANCE INDICATORS.—

18 “(1) IN GENERAL.—Each State, in consultation
19 with the Secretary, shall collect and submit to the
20 Secretary the information necessary for each indi-
21 cator described in paragraph (2), for fiscal year
22 2025 and each fiscal year thereafter.

23 “(2) INDICATORS OF PERFORMANCE.—The in-
24 dicators described in this paragraph for a fiscal year
25 are the following:

1 “(A) The percentage of individuals who
2 were work-eligible individuals as of the time of
3 exit from the program, who are in unsubsidized
4 employment during the second quarter after the
5 exit.

6 “(B) The percentage of individuals who
7 were work-eligible individuals who were in un-
8 subsidized employment in the second quarter
9 after the exit, who are also in unsubsidized em-
10 ployment during the fourth quarter after the
11 exit.

12 “(C) The median earnings of individuals
13 who were work-eligible individuals as of the
14 time of exit from the program, who are in un-
15 subsidized employment during the second quar-
16 ter after the exit.

17 “(D) The percentage of individuals who
18 have not attained 24 years of age, are attending
19 high school or enrolled in an equivalency pro-
20 gram, and are work-eligible individuals or were
21 work-eligible individuals as of the time of exit
22 from the program, who obtain a high school de-
23 gree or its recognized equivalent while receiving
24 assistance under the State program funded
25 under this part or within 1 year after the exit.

1 “(3) DEFINITION OF EXIT.—In paragraph (2),
2 the term ‘exit’ means, with respect to a State pro-
3 gram funded under this part, ceases to receive as-
4 sistance under the program funded by this part.

5 “(4) REGULATIONS.—In order to ensure na-
6 tionwide comparability of data, the Secretary, after
7 consultation with the Secretary of Labor and with
8 States, shall issue regulations governing the report-
9 ing of performance indicators under this sub-
10 section.”.

11 **SEC. 305. EFFECTIVE DATE.**

12 The amendments made by this title shall take effect
13 on October 1, 2024.
