6 (a) IN GENERAL.—Subject to subsection (c), with respect to amounts expended by a State for medical assist-7 ance for services described in subsection (b) that are fur-8 9 nished during the period beginning on April 1, 2021 and ending on March 31, 2022, the Federal medical assistance 10 11 percentage that would otherwise apply with respect to 12 such State and such services under title XIX of the Social Security Act (42 U.S.C. 1396 et seq.) shall be increased 13 14 (in addition to any other increase to such percentage) by 15 7.35 percentage points with respect to expenditures of the State under the State Medicaid program for such services 16 furnished during such period. In no case may the applica-17 tion of the previous sentence result in the Federal medical 18

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assistance percentage determined for a State being more 1 2 than 95 percent with respect to such expenditures. Any payment made to Puerto Rico, the Virgin Islands, Guam, 3 4 the Northern Mariana Islands, or American Samoa for ex-5 penditures on medical assistance that are subject to the 6 Federal medical assistance percentage increase specified 7 under the first sentence of this subsection shall not be 8 taken into account for purposes of applying payment lim-9 its under subsections (f) and (g) of section 1108 of the 10 Social Security Act (42 U.S.C. 1308).

(b) SERVICES DESCRIBED.—The services describedin this subsection are the following:

(1) Home and community-based services authorized under subsection (c), (d), (i), or (k) of section 1915 of the Social Security Act (42 U.S.C.
1396n) or under section 1115 of such Act (42
U.S.C. 1315).

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1 (4) PACE program services authorized under 2 section 1934 of the Social Security Act (42 U.S.C. 3 1396u-4). 4 (5) Mental health services as defined by the 5 Secretary of Health and Human Services. 6 (6) Substance use disorder treatment or recov-7 ery services as defined by the Secretary of Health 8 and Human Services. 9 (c) LIMITATION; REQUIREMENT.— 10 (1) LIMITATION.—In no case shall any increase 11 to the Federal medical assistance percentage for a 12 State pursuant to subsection (a) result in the appli-13 cation of a Federal medical assistance percentage 14 that exceeds 95 percent. 15 (2) Requirement to use additional funds 16 TO INCREASE PROVIDER PAYMENT RATES.—A State 17 may not receive the increase to the Federal medical 18 assistance percentage for the State described in sub-

19 assistance percentage for the state described in sub-19 section (a) unless the State certifies that it will use 20 the additional funds received by the State as a result 21 of such increase to increase payment rates for pro-22 viders of services described in subsection (b) during 23 the period described in the first sentence of sub-24 section (a) and to reduce waiting lists to receive 25 home and community-based services. Nothing in the 4

1 previous sentence shall be construed as preventing a 2 State, after the State has used such additional funds 3 to increase provider payment rates and to reduce 4 waiting lists to receive home and community-based 5 services, from determining how to utilize any remaining funds to provide home and community-6 7 based services, substance use disorder services, and 8 mental health services under the State plan.

9 (d) STATE DEFINED.—In this section, the term 10 "State" means each of the 50 States, the District of Co-11 lumbia, American Samoa, Guam, the Commonwealth of 12 the Northern Mariana Islands, Puerto Rico, and the 13 United States Virgin Islands.

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
