

AMENDMENT TO RULES COMMITTEE PRINT 118-

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OFFERED BY MRS. CAMMACK OF FLORIDA

At the end of division C, insert the following:

1 **TITLE XXXVI—TAIWAN**
2 **PRECLEARANCE**

3 **SEC. 3601. SENSE OF CONGRESS.**

4 It is the sense of Congress that—

5 (1) Taiwan is a steadfast partner of the United
6 States in the common pursuit of a free and open
7 Indo-Pacific region; and

8 (2) the United States should prioritize the es-
9 tablishment of preclearance facilities and other secu-
10 rity programs with allies and partners in the Indo-
11 Pacific region, including Taiwan.

12 **SEC. 3602. DEFINED TERM.**

13 In this title, the term “appropriate congressional
14 committees” means—

15 (1) the Committee on Homeland Security and
16 Governmental Affairs of the Senate;

17 (2) the Committee on Finance of the Senate;

18 (3) the Committee on Commerce, Science, and
19 Transportation of the Senate;

1 (4) the Committee on Homeland Security of the
2 House of Representatives; and

3 (5) the Committee on Ways and Means of the
4 House of Representatives.

5 **SEC. 3603. REPORT.**

6 Not later than 180 days after the date of the enact-
7 ment of this title, the Secretary of Homeland Security,
8 in consultation with the Secretary of Commerce, shall sub-
9 mit a report to the appropriate congressional committees
10 that—

11 (1) analyzes the feasibility and advisability for
12 the establishment of a preclearance facility in Tai-
13 wan;

14 (2) describes the plan for the establishment of
15 a preclearance facility in Taiwan or in other coun-
16 tries in the Indo-Pacific region;

17 (3) assesses the impacts that preclearance oper-
18 ations in Taiwan will have on—

19 (A) the security partnership between the
20 United States and Taiwan;

21 (B) trade between the United States and
22 Taiwan, including the impact on established
23 supply chains;

1 (C) the tourism industry in the United
2 States, including the potential impact on rev-
3 enue and tourist-related commerce;

4 (D) United States and foreign passengers
5 traveling to the United States for business-re-
6 lated activities;

7 (E) cost savings and potential market ac-
8 cess by expanding operations into the Indo-Pa-
9 cific region;

10 (F) opportunities for government-to-gov-
11 ernment collaboration available in Taiwan after
12 preclearance operations are established; and

13 (G) U.S. Customs and Border Patrol inter-
14 national and domestic port of entry staffing;
15 and

16 (4) includes country-specific information on the
17 anticipated homeland security benefits and the secu-
18 rity vulnerabilities associated with conducting
19 preclearance operations in Taiwan.
