## 1 SEC. 614. POLICY STATEMENT ON IMMIGRATION REFORM.

2 (a) FINDINGS.—The House finds that—

3 (1) fixing the country's broken immigration sys4 tem will mean a stronger economy and lower budget
5 deficits;

6 (2) the Congressional Budget Office estimates 7 that enacting H.R. 15, the Border Security, Eco-8 nomic Opportunity, and Immigration Modernization 9 Act, will reduce the deficit by \$900 billion over the 10 next two decades, boost the economy by 5.4 percent, 11 and increase productivity by 1.0 percent;

(3) the Social Security Actuary estimates that
immigration reform will add up to \$300 billion to
the Social Security Trust Fund over the next decade
and will extend Social Security solvency by up to two
years;

17 (4) America is a nation founded, built and sus-18 tained by immigrants, and we have a responsibility

to harness the power of that tradition by imple menting an effective immigration policy;

(5) the current immigration system is broken 3 4 because it keeps families of legal immigrants and 5 U.S. citizens separated for decades, it allows for the 6 exploitation of undocumented workers to the det-7 riment of all workers, it discourages legal immigra-8 tion and does not meet the needs of our economy, 9 and it keeps millions of hardworking, law abiding 10 families who have lived in our communities for dec-11 ades hiding in the shadows, which includes many 12 thousands who came to the U.S. as infants or young 13 children;

14 (6) it has been nearly 300 days since the Sen15 ate passed, on a bipartisan basis, its comprehensive
16 immigration reform bill;

17 (7) immigration reform is needed to secure the
18 sovereignty of the United States of America and to
19 establish a coherent and just system for integrating
20 those who seek to join American society;

(8) as a nation, we have the right and responsibility to make our borders safe, to establish clear
and just rules for seeking citizenship, to control the
flow of legal immigration, and to eliminate illegal

immigration, which in some cases has become a
 threat to our national security; and

(9) a successful immigration system will mean
smarter, more accountable and efficient border security; a system that promotes the reunification of
families; a system that protects workers and is responsive to the needs of employers; strong employment verification laws; and an inclusive legalization
program for those who are currently here.

10 (b) SENSE OF THE HOUSE.—It is the sense of the 11 House of Representatives that it is imperative that the full 12 House vote on comprehensive immigration reform – such 13 as H.R. 15, the Border Security, Economic Opportunity, 14 and Immigration Modernization Act – to establish clear 15 and just rules for citizenship, secure our borders, boost 16 our economy, and lower deficits.

At the appropriate place in the Committee Report, insert the following: "The resolution accommodates H.R. 15, the Border Security, Economic Opportunity, and Immigration Modernization Act. Immigration reform will not only bring clear and just rules for those seeking citizenship and help secure our borders, but it will also boost the economy and reduce budget deficits. The Congressional Budget Office estimates H.R. 15 will reduce the deficit by \$900 billion over the next two decades, boost the economy by 5.4 percent, and increase productivity by 1.0 percent.".
