AMENDMENT TO THE RULES COMMITTEE PRINT OF H.R. 4310

OFFERED BY MR. CARSON OF INDIANA

At the end of subtitle D of title VI, add the following new section:

1	SEC. 633. STUDY OF CURRENT AVAILABILITY OF COLLEGE
2	CREDIT FOR MILITARY EDUCATION, TRAIN-
3	ING, AND EXPERIENCES OF MEMBERS OF
4	THE ARMED FORCES AND DEVELOPMENT OF
5	RECOMMENDATIONS FOR ADDITIONAL COL-
6	LEGE CREDIT.

7 (a) STUDY REQUIRED.—Subject to subsection (d), the Secretary of Defense shall conduct a study regarding 8 9 the award of academic credits by institutions of higher education based on military occupational specialties held 10 11 by members of the Armed Forces and other learning experiences of members during their service in the Armed 12 Forces. As part of the study, the Secretary shall determine 13 14 the types of academic credits typically awarded to mem-15 bers of the Armed Forces and veterans upon admission, and the additional course credits that could be awarded, 16 17 based on $\mathbf{2}$

(1) the military occupational specialties held by
 members;

3 (2) the educational opportunities and training4 provided to such members; and

5 (3) other learning experiences associated with
6 service in the Armed Forces, including types of do7 mestic and overseas deployments, such as combat,
8 humanitarian, peace keeping, and disaster relief.

9 (b) ACADEMIC CREDIT PROCESSING RECOMMENDA-TIONS.—Subject to subsection (d), on the basis of the 10 study conducted under subsection (a), the Secretary shall 11 12 make recommendations to institutions of higher education 13 regarding policies on awarding academic credit that can be adopted to ensure that members of the Armed Forces 14 15 receive academic credits that accurately reflect the military occupational specialties held by the members and the 16 17 military education and training and other learning experi-18 ences gained during service in the Armed Forces.

19 (c) CONSULTATION.—The Secretary shall conduct20 the study under subsection (a) in consultation with—

21 (1) the Secretary of Veterans Affairs and the22 Secretary of Education; and

(2) institutions of higher education and accreditation organizations to establish a system of analysis
and accreditation that would allow for the expedited

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- awarding by institutions of higher education of aca demic credits earned by members.
- 3 (d) USE OF DIRECTIVES, INSTRUCTIONS, OR OTHER
 4 PUBLICATIONS.—Notwithstanding subsections (a) and
 5 (b), the Secretary, in lieu of or in addition to conducting
 6 a study under subsection (a), may use any relevant direc7 tives, instructions, or other publications of the Depart8 ment of Defense to make recommendations under sub9 section (b) or prepare a report under subsection (e).
- 10 (e) Reporting Requirements.—
- (1) INITIAL REPORT ON RECOMMENDATIONS.—
 Not later than 180 days after the date of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary shall submit to Congress a report containing the recommendations developed under subsection (b) regarding policies on
 awarding academic credit to members of the Armed
 Forces.
- (2) PROGRESS REPORTS.—The Secretary of Defense shall submit to Congress an annual report on
 the extent to which institutions of higher education
 have adopted the recommendations.
- (f) PUBLICATION OF INFORMATION.—Not later than
 180 days after making recommendations under subsection
 (b), the Secretary shall—

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1	(1) establish a process for soliciting, accepting,
2	and publishing and continuously updating on the
3	Internet website of the Department of Defense, in-
4	formation on the academic credit awarded by institu-
5	tions of higher education for the military occupa-
6	tional specialties held by members of the Armed
7	Forces, the military education and training, and
8	other learning experiences gained during service in
9	the Armed Forces, including information on—
10	(A) the institutions of higher education
11	that provide such academic credit;
12	(B) the recommendations with respect to
13	providing such academic credit made by the
14	Secretary to such institutions based on studies
15	conduct by the Secretary, and the results of the
16	study conducted under subsection (a), if avail-
17	able;
18	(C) whether and the extent to which such
19	institutions are following the recommendations
20	described in subparagraph (B); and
21	(D) the specific courses or course types for
22	which the institutions provide such academic
23	credit;

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1	(2) publish and make publicly available such in-
2	formation on the Internet website of the Department
3	of Defense; and
4	(3) conduct outreach to ensure that members of
5	the Armed Forces (including members of the Na-
6	tional Guard and Reserves) are aware of the avail-
7	ability of such information.
8	(g) DEFINITIONS.—For purposes of this section:
9	(1) INSTITUTION OF HIGHER EDUCATION.—The
10	term "institution of higher education" has the
11	meaning given the term in section 102 of the Higher
12	Education Act of 1965 (20 U.S.C. 1002).
13	(2) Secretary.—The term "Secretary" means
14	the Secretary of Defense.

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
