

**AMENDMENT TO RULES COMM. PRINT 119-33**  
**OFFERED BY MR. CARTER OF LOUISIANA**

In title VI, subtitle E, add at the end the following  
new section:

1 **SEC. 6 \_\_\_\_ . PROHIBITION ON PROCUREMENT AND COM-**  
2 **MISSARY SALES OF SEAFOOD ORIGINATING**  
3 **OR PROCESSED IN THE PEOPLE'S REPUBLIC**  
4 **OF CHINA.**

5 (a) PROHIBITION ON PROCUREMENT OF SEAFOOD  
6 ORIGINATING OR PROCESSED IN THE PEOPLE'S REPUB-  
7 LIC OF CHINA FOR MILITARY DINING FACILITIES.—

8 (1) IN GENERAL.—Except as provided by para-  
9 graph (2) or (3), the Secretary of Defense may not  
10 enter into a contract for the procurement of seafood  
11 that originates or is processed in the People's Re-  
12 public of China for use in military dining facilities,  
13 including galleys onboard United States naval ves-  
14 sels.

15 (2) EXCEPTIONS.—

16 (A) UNDUE BURDEN.—The Secretary of  
17 Defense, or a designee of the Secretary, may  
18 grant exceptions to the prohibition under para-  
19 graph (1) to facilities on military installations

1 located outside of the United States if such pro-  
2 hibition would unduly burden or prevent sea-  
3 food from being served at such facility.

4 (B) UNITED STATES VESSELS VISITING  
5 FOREIGN PORTS.—The Secretary of Defense, or  
6 a designee of the Secretary, may grant excep-  
7 tions to the prohibition under paragraph (1) to  
8 United States vessels visiting foreign ports.

9 (3) WAIVER.—The Secretary of Defense may  
10 waive the prohibition under paragraph (1).

11 (b) PROHIBITION ON SALES OF SEAFOOD ORIGI-  
12 NATING IN THE PEOPLE’S REPUBLIC OF CHINA AT COM-  
13 MISSARY STORES.—

14 (1) IN GENERAL.—Section 2484 of title 10,  
15 United States Code, is amended by adding at the  
16 end the following new subsection:

17 “(m) PROHIBITION ON SALES OF SEAFOOD ORIGI-  
18 NATING IN THE PEOPLE’S REPUBLIC OF CHINA.—

19 “(1) IN GENERAL.—Except as provided by  
20 paragraph (2), raw or processed seafood or seafood  
21 products originating in the People’s Republic of  
22 China may not be sold at commissary stores.

23 “(2) WAIVER.—The Secretary of Defense may  
24 waive the prohibition under paragraph (1).”.

1           (2) BRIEFING ON COMPLIANCE.—Section  
2           2481(e)(4) of such title is amended—

3                   (A) in subparagraph (D), by striking “;  
4                   and” and inserting a semicolon;

5                   (B) by redesignating subparagraph (E) as  
6                   subparagraph (F); and

7                   (C) by inserting after subparagraph (D)  
8                   the following new subparagraph (E):

9                   “(E) an assessment of compliance with the pro-  
10                  hibition under section 2484(m) of this title; and”.

11           (3) TRANSITION RULES.—

12                   (A) APPLICABILITY.—The prohibition  
13                   under subsection (m) of section 2484 of title  
14                   10, United States Code, as added by paragraph  
15                   (1), shall apply on and after the date that is 30  
16                   days after the date of the enactment of this  
17                   Act.

18                   (B) DISPOSAL OF REMAINING STOCK.—  
19                   The Director of the Defense Commissary Agen-  
20                   cy may determine how to dispose of any stock  
21                   covered by the prohibition under subsection (m)  
22                   of section 2484 of title 10, United States Code,  
23                   as added by paragraph (1), that remains as of  
24                   the date described in subparagraph (A).

1           (c) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The prohibitions under this  
2 section, and the amendments made by this section, shall  
3 take effect 90 days after the date of the enactment of this  
4 Act.
