Page 104, after line 6, insert the following:

1 **SEC. 337. PLAN ON EXTREME WEATHER CONSIDERATIONS**  
2 **FOR DEPARTMENT OF DEFENSE.**

3 (a) SUBMITTAL OF PLANS.—Not later than one year  
4 after the date of the enactment of this Act, and every two  
5 years thereafter, each official referred to in subsection (c)  
6 shall submit to Congress a comprehensive plan that inte-  
7 grates consideration of extreme weather into the oper-  
8 ations and overall mission objectives of the Department  
9 administered by that official (hereinafter referred to as an  
10 “extreme weather plan”).

11 (b) MATTERS FOR INCLUSION.—An extreme weather  
12 plan under this section shall include—

13 (1) identification and assessment of extreme  
14 weather-related impacts on, and risks to—

15 (A) the ability of the Department to ac-  
16 complish its missions, operations, and pro-  
17 grams; and

18 (B) State and local entities;

1           (2) identification and assessment of barriers  
2           posed by Department programs to State and local  
3           extreme weather resilience, preparedness, and risk  
4           management efforts;

5           (3) a description of programs, policies, and  
6           plans the Department has already put in place, as  
7           well as additional actions the Department plans to  
8           take, to manage extreme weather risks in the near  
9           term and build resilience in the short and long term;

10          (4) a description of how the Department plans  
11          to consider the need to improve extreme weather re-  
12          silience, preparedness, and risk management, includ-  
13          ing the costs and benefits of such improvement, with  
14          respect to agency suppliers, supply chain, real prop-  
15          erty investments, and capital equipment purchases,  
16          including by updating agency policies for leasing,  
17          building upgrades, relocation of existing facilities  
18          and equipment, and construction of new facilities;

19          (5) a description of how the Department plans  
20          to support any ongoing or future public-private part-  
21          nership to improve extreme weather resilience, pre-  
22          paredness, and risk management, including the cost  
23          and benefits of technology improvements, hardening,  
24          or rapid restoration; and

1           (6) a description of how the Department plans  
2           to contribute to coordinated interagency efforts to  
3           support extreme weather resilience, preparedness,  
4           and risk management at all levels of government, in-  
5           cluding collaborative work across agencies' regional  
6           offices and hubs, and through coordinated develop-  
7           ment of information, data, and tools.

8           (c) OFFICIALS.—The officials referred to in this sub-  
9           section are the following:

- 10           (1) Secretary of State.
- 11           (2) Secretary of Defense.
- 12           (3) Secretary of the Interior.
- 13           (4) Secretary of Labor.
- 14           (5) Secretary of Transportation.
- 15           (6) Secretary of Energy.
- 16           (7) Secretary of Education.
- 17           (8) Secretary of Veterans Affairs.
- 18           (9) Director of National Intelligence.
- 19           (10) Representative of the United States to the  
20           United Nations.
- 21           (11) Director of the Office of Management and  
22           Budget.
- 23           (12) Director of the Central Intelligence Agen-  
24           cy.

1           (13) Administrator of the Environmental Pro-  
2           tection Agency.

3           (d) MEANING OF “DEPARTMENT”.—In this section,  
4           the term “Department” includes and office or agency, as  
5           appropriate.
