1SEC. 337. PLAN ON EXTREME WEATHER CONSIDERATIONS2FOR DEPARTMENT OF DEFENSE.

3 (a) SUBMITTAL OF PLANS.—Not later than one year 4 after the date of the enactment of this Act, and every two 5 years thereafter, each official referred to in subsection (c) shall submit to Congress a comprehensive plan that inte-6 7 grates consideration of extreme weather into the operations and overall mission objectives of the Department 8 9 administered by that official (hereinafter referred to as an 10 "extreme weather plan").

(b) MATTERS FOR INCLUSION.—An extreme weatherplan under this section shall include—

(1) identification and assessment of extreme
weather-related impacts on, and risks to—

15 (A) the ability of the Department to ac16 complish its missions, operations, and pro17 grams; and

18 (B) State and local entities;

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(2) identification and assessment of barriers
 posed by Department programs to State and local
 extreme weather resilience, preparedness, and risk
 management efforts;

5 (3) a description of programs, policies, and 6 plans the Department has already put in place, as 7 well as additional actions the Department plans to 8 take, to manage extreme weather risks in the near 9 term and build resilience in the short and long term;

10 (4) a description of how the Department plans 11 to consider the need to improve extreme weather re-12 silience, preparedness, and risk management, including the costs and benefits of such improvement, with 13 14 respect to agency suppliers, supply chain, real prop-15 erty investments, and capital equipment purchases, 16 including by updating agency policies for leasing, 17 building upgrades, relocation of existing facilities 18 and equipment, and construction of new facilities;

(5) a description of how the Department plans
to support any ongoing or future public-private partnership to improve extreme weather resilience, preparedness, and risk management, including the cost
and benefits of technology improvements, hardening,
or rapid restoration; and
