3 centage of the total amount disbursed by the program.  
4 The review shall also include recommendations relating  
5 to—

6 (1) social, educational, economic, and any other  
7 factor that may contribute to a Native Hawaiian be-  
8 coming a missing or murdered Native Hawaiian; and

9 (2) legislation to reduce the likelihood that a  
10 Native Hawaiian may become a missing or murdered  
11 Native Hawaiian.

12 (b) REVIEW OF NATIVE HAWAIIAN VICTIMS OF VAR-  
13 IOUS CRIMES.—Not later than 180 days after the date  
14 of enactment of this Act, the Attorney General shall con-  
15 duct a comprehensive review of programs that provide  
16 services to victims of criminal offenses affecting Native  
17 Hawaiians, including child sexual exploitation, child abuse,  
18 intimate partner violence, human trafficking, and sub-  
19 stance abuse. The report shall include for each such pro-  
20 gram the amount of Federal funding that is received by  
21 Native Hawaiian-serving organizations as a percentage  
22 of—

23 (1) the total amount disbursed by the program;  
24 and

1           (2) the total amount of Federal funds disbursed  
2           by the program.

3           (c) REPORT ON NATIVE HAWAIIANS IN THE CRIMI-  
4           NAL JUSTICE SYSTEM.—

5           (1) CRIMINAL JUSTICE SYSTEM.—Not later  
6           than 180 days after the date of enactment of this  
7           Act, the Attorney General, acting through the Na-  
8           tional Institute of Justice, in coordination with the  
9           Bureau of Justice Statistics, shall report on the  
10          interaction of Native Hawaiians with the criminal  
11          justice system, including the percentage of persons  
12          who are Native Hawaiians out of the total of—

13                   (A) all persons arrested;

14                   (B) all persons detained in Federal, State,  
15                   and local jails;

16                   (C) all persons subject to pretrial super-  
17                   vision;

18                   (D) all persons subject to post-conviction  
19                   supervision;

20                   (E) all persons incarcerated in Federal and  
21                   State prisons; and

22                   (F) all persons subject to post-release su-  
23                   pervision.

24           (2) PROGRAMS AND SERVICES.—The report  
25          shall also include the programs and services avail-

1       able to and used by Native Hawaiians in various ju-  
2       risdictions, including diversion programs, in-prison  
3       education programs, and reentry services. The re-  
4       port shall also include the number of culturally rel-  
5       evant programs available to Native Hawaiians who  
6       interact with the criminal justice system. The report  
7       shall also include data on the number of Native Ha-  
8       waiians who are incarcerated and placed in Federal  
9       and private facilities more than 200 miles from their  
10      place of residence.

11           (3) RECOMMENDATIONS.—The report shall also  
12      include recommendations relating to—

13           (A) social, educational, economic, and any  
14      other factor that may contribute to a Native  
15      Hawaiian becoming involved in the criminal jus-  
16      tice system; and

17           (B) legislation to reduce the likelihood that  
18      a Native Hawaiian may become involved in the  
19      criminal justice system.
