At the end of subtitle E of title X, add the following new section:

1	SEC. 10 STUDY ON PUBLIC, PRIVATE, AND ALLIED
2	SHIPYARD CAPABILITIES FOR INDO-PACIFIC
3	REGION CONFLICTS.
4	(a) Study Required.—Not later than 180 days
5	after the date of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary
6	of the Navy, in coordination with the Commander of the
7	United States Indo-Pacific Command, shall conduct a
8	study to assess the capacity of each United States public
9	and private shipyard, and each foreign shipyard of an al-
10	lied or partner country, to support battle damage repair
11	in the event of an armed conflict in the Indo-Pacific re-
12	gion.
13	(b) Elements.—The study under subsection (a)
14	shall include the following:
15	(1) An assessment of the major infrastructure,
16	facilities, and equipment of United States public and
17	private shipyards in the Indo-Pacific region capable
18	of use by the United States Armed Forces for battle

1	damage repair during an armed conflict with a near-
2	peer competitor in such region.
3	(2) An evaluation of the workforce of United
4	States public and private shipyards in the Indo-Pa-
5	cific region, including the availability, training, and
6	projected needs of such workforce to support such
7	battle damage repair.
8	(3) An assessment of the public and private
9	personnel, infrastructure, facilities, and equipment
10	of foreign shipyards of allied or partner countries in
11	the Indo-Pacific region capable of supporting the
12	United States Armed Forces with respect to such
13	battle damage repair.
14	(4) An analysis of supply chain resilience and
15	vulnerabilities relating to such battle damage repair.
16	(5) Recommendations for strategic investments
17	or policy changes necessary to expand or modernize
18	public or private shipyard capacity to support such
19	battle damage repair.
20	(c) Report to Congress.—Not later than 90 days
21	after the date on which the Secretary concludes the study
22	under subsection (a), the Secretary shall submit to the
23	congressional defense committees a report containing the

- 2 retary considers appropriate.
