## AMENDMENT TO RULES COMM. PRINT 117– OFFERED BY MR. CASE OF HAWAII

## **National Defense Authorization Bill**

At the end of subtitle H of title XXVIII, add the following new section:

1	SEC. 28 FIVE-YEAR UPDATES OF HAWAII MILITARY
2	LAND USE MASTER PLAN.
3	(a) FINDINGS.—Congress finds the following:
4	(1) The continued presence of the Armed
5	Forces and Department of Defense in the State of
6	Hawai'i supports the United State's objective of a
7	free and open Indo-Pacific region.
8	(2) Given the strategic location of Hawai'i in
9	the central Pacific, the State is home to the United
10	States Indo-Pacific Command and all of its sub-
11	component commanders.
12	(3) The Armed Forces and Department of De-
13	fense presence in Hawai'i is extensive and significant
14	despite the limited geography of the State.
15	(b) Sense of Congress.—Given the extent and sig-
16	nificance of the Armed Forces and Department of Defense
17	presence in Hawai'i and the limited geography of the

1	State, it is the sense of Congress that the Secretary of
2	Defense should—
3	(1) synchronize all of the Armed Forces' train-
4	ing activities, land holdings, and operations for the
5	most efficient use and stewardship of land in
6	Hawaiʻi; and
7	(2) ensure that the partnership between the
8	DoD and State of Hawai'i is mutually advantageous
9	and based on the following principles:
10	(A) Respect for the land, people, and cul-
11	ture of Hawaiʻi.
12	(B) Commitment to building strong, resil-
13	ient communities.
14	(C) Maximum joint use of Department of
15	Defense land holdings.
16	(D) Optimization of existing Armed Forces
17	training, operational, and administrative facili-
18	ties.
19	(E) Synchronized communication from
20	United States Indo-Pacific Command across all
21	military components with State government,
22	State agencies, county governments, commu-
23	nities, and Federal agencies on critical land and
24	environmental topics.
25	(c) Required Update of Master Plan.—

1	(1) Plan update required.—Not later than
2	December 31, 2025, and every five years thereafter
3	through December 31, 2045, the Deputy Assistant
4	Secretary of Defense for Real Property shall update
5	the Hawai'i Military Land Use Master Plan, which
6	was first produced by the Department of Defense in
7	1995 and updated in 2002 and 2021.
8	(2) Elements.—In updating the Hawai'i Mili-
9	tary Land Use Master Plan, the Deputy Assistant
10	Secretary of Defense for Real Property shall con-
11	sider, address, and include the following:
12	(A) The priorities of each individual
13	Armed Force and joint priorities within the
14	State of Hawai'i.
15	(B) The historical background of Armed
16	Forces and Department of Defense use of lands
17	in Hawai'i and the cultural significance of the
18	historical land holdings.
19	(C) A summary of all leases and easements
20	held by the Department.
21	(D) An overview of Army, Navy, Marine
22	Corps, Air Force, Space Force, Coast Guard,
23	Hawai'i National Guard, and Hawai'i Air Na-
24	tional Guard assets in the State, including the
25	following for each asset:

1	(i) The location and size of facilities.
2	(ii) Any tenet commands.
3	(iii) Training lands.
4	(iv) Purpose of the asset.
5	(v) Priorities for the asset for the next
6	five years, including any planned
7	divestitures and expansions.
8	(E) A summary of encroachment planning
9	efforts.
10	(F) A summary of efforts to synchronize
11	the inter-service use of training lands and
12	ranges.
13	(3) Cooperation.—The Deputy Assistant Sec-
14	retary of Defense for Real Property shall carry out
15	this subsection in conjunction with the Commander
16	of United States Indo-Pacific Command.
17	(d) Submission of Updated Plan.—Not later than
18	30 days after the date of the completion of an update to
19	the Hawai'i Military Land Use Master Plan under sub-
20	section (c), the Deputy Assistant Secretary of Defense for
21	Real Property shall submit the updated master plan to
22	the Committees on Armed Services of the Senate and the
23	House of Representatives.
