

**AMENDMENT TO  
RULES COMMITTEE PRINT 118–10  
OFFERED BY MR. CASE OF HAWAII**

Page 1033, after line 14, insert the following:

1 **SECTION 1859. REGISTRY FOR IMPACTED INDIVIDUALS OF**  
2 **THE RED HILL INCIDENT.**

3 (a) ESTABLISHMENT OF REGISTRY.—The Secretary  
4 of Health and Human Services (referred to in this section  
5 as the “Secretary”) shall establish within the Agency for  
6 Toxic Substances and Disease Registry or the Centers for  
7 Disease Control and Prevention or through an award of  
8 a grant or contract, as the Secretary determines appro-  
9 priate, a Red Hill Incident exposure registry to collect  
10 data on health implications of petroleum contaminated  
11 water for impacted individuals on a voluntary basis. Such  
12 registry shall be complementary to, and not duplicative of,  
13 the Red Hill Incident Report of the Defense Occupational  
14 and Environmental Health Readiness System.

15 (b) OTHER RESPONSIBILITIES.—

16 (1) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary, in coordina-  
17 tion with the Director of the Centers for Disease  
18 Control and Prevention, and in consultation with the  
19 Secretary of Defense, the Secretary of Veterans Af-

1       fairs, and such State and local authorities or other  
2       partners as the Secretary of Health and Human  
3       Services considers appropriate, shall—

4               (A) review the Federal programs and serv-  
5       ices available to individuals exposed to petro-  
6       leum;

7               (B) review current research on petroleum  
8       exposure in order to identify additional research  
9       needs;

10              (C) identify effective services, individuals  
11       and communities affected by petroleum con-  
12       taminated water; and

13              (D) undertake any other review or activi-  
14       ties that the Secretary determines to be appro-  
15       priate.

16              (2) REPORT.—Not later than 1 year after the  
17       date of enactment of this Act, and annually there-  
18       after for 6 additional years, the Secretary shall sub-  
19       mit to the appropriate congressional committees a  
20       report on the review and activities undertaken under  
21       paragraph (1) that includes—

22              (A) strategies for communicating and en-  
23       gaging with stakeholders on the Red Hill Inci-  
24       dent;

1 (B) the number of impacted and poten-  
2 tially impacted individuals enrolled in the reg-  
3 istry established under subsection (a);

4 (C) processes for referring such registry  
5 enrollees to comprehensive, coordinated services  
6 to mitigate the effects of petroleum exposure;

7 (D) measures and frequency of follow-up  
8 to collect data and specimens related to expo-  
9 sure, health, and developmental milestones as  
10 appropriate; and

11 (E) a summary of data and analyses on  
12 exposure, health, and developmental milestones  
13 for impacted individuals.

14 (3) CONSULTATION.—In carrying out para-  
15 graphs (1) and (2), the Secretary shall consult  
16 with—

17 (A) non-Federal experts, including persons  
18 with certification in epidemiology, toxicology,  
19 mental health, pediatrics, and environmental  
20 health; and

21 (B) members of the impacted community.

22 (c) FUNDING.—Without regard to section 2215 of  
23 title 10, United States Code, the Secretary of the Defense  
24 is authorized to provide, from amounts made available to  
25 such Secretary, such sums as may be necessary for each

1 of fiscal years 2024 through 2030 for the Secretary of  
2 Health and Human Services to carry out this section.
