At the appropriate place in subtitle C of title XIII, insert the following:

1 SEC. 13____. POLITICAL WARFARE DEFENSE ASSESSMENT 2 ACT.

3 (a) REPORT.—Not later than 180 days after the date
4 of the enactment of this Act, the President shall conduct
5 a review and submit to the appropriate congressional com6 mittees a report on the capabilities of the United States
7 to conduct and respond to gray zone campaigns.

8 (b) ELEMENTS.—The report shall set forth the fol-9 lowing with respect to each covered agency:

10 (1) The capabilities, offices, and units that are
11 especially suited to gray zone operations and a de12 scription of the roles each can play.

13 (2) A list of activities that are currently being
14 undertaken to respond to adversary gray zone cam15 paigns.

16 (3) Any proposed necessary investments to sig17 nificantly increase their capability to mitigate gray
18 zone threats, the rationale for each, and expected
19 cost.

1	(4) Recommendations for addressing gaps with-
2	in covered agencies, between covered agencies, and
3	in the interagency coordination of elements of cov-
4	ered agencies, identified in the course of the review
5	conducted, including a discussion of the manner and
6	extent to which such recommendations will be suffi-
7	cient to achieve United States gray zone objectives
8	and to counter adversary gray zone campaigns.
9	(5) A description of the institutional reforms
10	undertaken or planned to be undertaken to address
11	the gaps identified pursuant to paragraph (4) to bet-
12	ter enable effective gray zone campaigns.
13	(6) A description of any proposed institutional
14	reform, including for which the President requires
15	additional statutory authority and a justification for
16	such additional authority.
17	(7) A description of the process for determining
18	political warfare tolerance, including for—
19	(A) determining which adversary gray zone
20	activities are unacceptable;
21	(B) communicating these positions to ad-
22	versaries; and
23	(C) establishing and regularly reviewing
24	protocols with allies and partners to respond to
25	such activities.

(c) SUBDIVISIONS WITH RESPECT TO CERTAIN COV ERED AGENCIES.—In addition to the elements described
 in subsection (b) with respect to the agency as a whole,
 the report required under subsection (a) shall also include
 specifically disaggregated information on the following:

6 (1) With respect to the section of the report re7 lating to the Department of Defense, the informa8 tion described in subsections (b)(1) through (b)(5)
9 with respect to each military service and regional
10 combatant command, as appropriate.

11 (2) With respect to the section of the report re-12 lating to the Department of State, an identification 13 of 25 priority countries at the front lines of adver-14 sary gray zone aggression and a discussion of the 15 questions posed by subsections (b)(1) through (b)(3)developed in consultation with relevant embassy 16 17 country teams and the Global Engagement Center. 18 (d) FORM.—The report described in this section shall 19 be submitted in unclassified format and may contain a 20 classified annex.

14	(f) ANNUAL BRIEFING ON BUDGETING FOR EFFEC-
15	TIVE GRAY ZONE COMPETITION.—
16	(1) IN GENERAL.—The Director of the Office of
17	Management and Budget, the Secretary of State,
18	the Secretary of Defense, and the Director of Na-
19	tional Intelligence shall provide an annual, classified
20	briefing to the appropriate congressional committees
21	in which such officials shall provide an explanation
22	of the manner in which the funding levels proposed
23	in the budget submitted with respect to the upcom-
24	ing fiscal year will be sufficient to respond to adver-

sarial gray zone campaigns and to achieve United
 States gray zone objectives.

3 (2) TIMING.—The briefing described in para4 graph (1) shall be provided not later than 14 days
5 after submission of the materials in support of the
6 budget of the President (submitted to Congress pur7 suant to section 1105 of title 31, United States
8 Code) for a fiscal year.

9 (g) APPROPRIATE CONGRESSIONAL COMMITTEES
10 DEFINED.—In this section, the term "appropriate con11 gressional committees" means—

(1) the Committee on Foreign Affairs, the Permanent Select Committee on Intelligence, the Committee on Armed Services, the Committee on the Judiciary, the Committee on Financial Services, the
Committee on Energy and Commerce, and the Committee on Homeland Security of the House of Representatives; and

(2) the Committee on Foreign Relations, the
Select Committee on Intelligence, the Committee on
Armed Services, the Committee on the Judiciary, the
Committee on Banking, Housing, and Urban Affairs, the Committee on Commerce, Science, and

- 2 Security and Governmental Affairs of the Senate.

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
