Amendment to Rules Comm. Print 117–54 Offered by Mr. Chabot of Ohio

At the end of division E, add the following:

TITLE LIX—ACCELERATING ARMS TRANSFERS TO TAIWAN ACT

4 SEC. 5901. SHORT TITLE.

5 This title may be cited as the "Accelerating Arms6 Transfers to Taiwan Act".

7 SEC. 5902. FINDINGS.

8 Congress finds the following:

9 (1) The United States is committed to pro10 viding Taiwan arms of a defensive character under
11 section 2(b)(5) of the Taiwan Relations Act (22
12 U.S.C. 3301(b)(5)) and under the Six Assurances.

(2) The rapid military modernization undertaken by the People's Liberation Army has progressively sifted the balance of power in the Taiwan
Strait so that it is increasingly likely that the People's Republic of China will assess that it is viable
to determine the future of Taiwan by other than
peaceful means.

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1 SEC. 5903. SENSE OF CONGRESS.

2 It is the sense of Congress that the United States3 and Taiwan have not sufficiently sought to expedite the4 delivery of arms to Taiwan.

5 SEC. 5904. PRIORITY FOR DELIVERY OF EXCESS DEFENSE 6 ARTICLES TO TAIWAN.

7 Section 516(c)(2) of the Foreign Assistance Act of
8 1961 (22 U.S.C. 2321j(c)(2)) is amended by striking "and
9 to the Philippines" and inserting ", to the Philippines, and
10 to Taiwan".

11 SEC. 5905. USE OF SPECIAL DEFENSE ACQUISITION FUND.

12 The Secretary of Defense, in consultation with the 13 Secretary of State, shall seek to utilize the Special Defense 14 Acquisition Fund established under chapter 5 of the Arms 15 Export Control Act (22 U.S.C. 2795 et seq.) to expedite 16 the procurement and delivery of defense articles and de-17 fense services for the purpose of assisting and supporting 18 the armed forces of Taiwan.

19 SEC. 5906. ESTABLISHMENT OF WAR RESERVE STOCKPILE 20 IN TAIWAN.

Section 514(c)(2) of the Foreign Assistance Act of
1961 (22 U.S.C. 2321h(c)(2)) is amended by inserting
after "Thailand" the following ", Taiwan".

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1SEC. 5907. EMERGENCY DRAWDOWN AUTHORITY FOR TAI-2WAN STRAIT CONTINGENCIES.

3 The authority granted to the President under section
4 506(a) of the Foreign Assistance Act of 1961 (22 U.S.C.
5 2318(a)) shall be deemed to apply in the case of an un6 foreseen emergency in or around Taiwan.

7 SEC. 5908. REPORT.

8 (a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 60 days after the 9 date of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary of Defense 10 and the Secretary of State shall jointly submit to the ap-11 propriate congressional committees a report regarding the 12 planned use of the authorities described in this title and 13 the amendments made by this title.

14 (b) ELEMENTS.—The report required by subsection15 (a) shall include the following:

- 16 (1) With respect to the authorities provided
 17 under section 5904—
- 18 (A) a list of current and prospective excess
 19 defense articles that are or will be provided to
 20 Taiwan; and

(B) a list of excess defense articles determined to be required by Taiwan but the delivery of which was or will be prioritized for another country over the delivery of such articles
to Taiwan.

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(2) Current and prospective uses of the Special
 Defense Acquisition Fund to decrease timelines for
 the delivery of defense articles and services to Tai wan.

5 (3) The advantages of establishing a war re6 serve stockpile in Taiwan and the defense items nec7 essary to make such stockpile an effective contribu8 tion to coalition war fighting.

9 (4) With respect the authorities described in 10 section 5907, a description, informed by ongoing war 11 planning, of the anticipated defense articles and 12 services that Taiwan will require in the event of a 13 range of unforeseen defense emergencies, the cost of 14 such articles and services, and the capacity of the 15 United States to provide such articles and services 16 in a timely manner.

17 (c) FORM.—The report required by subsection (a)18 may be submitted in classified form.

19 (d) APPROPRIATE CONGRESSIONAL COMMITTEES
20 DEFINED.—In this section, the term "appropriate con21 gressional committees" means—

(1) the Committee on Foreign Affairs and the
Committee on Armed Services of the House of Representatives; and

- 1 (2) the Committee on Foreign Relations and
- 2 the Committee on Armed Services of the Senate.
