2 lying” after “hazing”;

3 (B) in paragraph (1)—

4 (i) in the matter preceding subpara-  
5 graph (A)—

6 (I) by striking “January 31,  
7 2021” and inserting “January 31,  
8 2027”; and

9 (II) by striking “each Secretary  
10 of a military department, in consulta-  
11 tion with the Chief of Staff of each  
12 Armed Force under the jurisdiction of  
13 such Secretary,” and inserting “the  
14 Secretary of Defense”;

15 (ii) in subparagraph (A), by inserting  
16 “or bullying” after “hazing”;

17 (iii) in subparagraph (B), by inserting  
18 “formally, informally, and” before “anony-  
19 mously”; and

20 (iv) in subparagraph (C), by inserting  
21 “and anti-bullying” after “anti-hazing”;  
22 and

23 (C) in amending paragraph (2) to read as  
24 follows:

1           “(2) ADDITIONAL ELEMENTS.—Each report re-  
2           quired by this subsection shall include the following:

3                   “(A) A description of comprehensive data-  
4                   collection systems of each Armed Force de-  
5                   scribed in subsection (b) and the Office of the  
6                   Secretary of Defense for collecting hazing or  
7                   bullying reports involving a member of the  
8                   Armed Forces, including formal, informal, and  
9                   anonymous reports.

10                   “(B) A description of processes of each  
11                   Armed Force described in subsection (b) to  
12                   identify, document, and report alleged instances  
13                   of hazing or bullying. Such description shall in-  
14                   clude the methodology each such Armed Force  
15                   uses to categorize and count potential instances  
16                   of hazing or bullying.

17                   “(C) An assessment by each Secretary of  
18                   a military department of the quality and need  
19                   for training on recognizing and preventing haz-  
20                   ing and bullying provided to members under the  
21                   jurisdiction of such Secretary.

22                   “(D) An assessment by the Office of the  
23                   Secretary of Defense of—

24                           “(i) the effectiveness of each Armed  
25                           Force described in subsection (b) in track-

1           ing and reporting instances of hazing or  
2           bullying;

3           “(ii) whether the performance of each  
4           such Armed Force was satisfactory or un-  
5           satisfactory in the preceding fiscal year.

6           “(E) Recommendations of the Secretary to  
7           improve—

8           “(i) elements described in subpara-  
9           graphs (A) through (D).

10           “(ii) the Uniform Code of Military  
11           Justice or the Manual for Courts-Martial  
12           to improve the prosecution of persons al-  
13           leged to have committed hazing or bullying  
14           in the Armed Forces.

15           “(F) The status of efforts of the Secretary  
16           to evaluate the prevalence of hazing and bul-  
17           lying in the Armed Forces.

18           “(G) Data on allegations of hazing and  
19           bullying in the Armed Forces, including—

20           “(i) number of formal, informal, and  
21           anonymous reports; and

22           “(ii) final disposition of investigations.

1                   “(H) Plans of the Secretary to improve  
2                   hazing and bullying prevention and response  
3                   during the next reporting year.”.
