

AMENDMENT TO RULES COMM. PRINT 118–10
OFFERED BY MR. CONNOLLY OF VIRGINIA

At the end of subtitle C of title XVIII, add the following:

1 **SEC. __. LIMITATION OF PROVISION OF DEFENSE ARTICLES**
2 **TO THE GOVERNMENT OF HUNGARY.**

3 (a) IN GENERAL.—The President may not sell or au-
4 thorize a license for the export of defense articles pursuant
5 to any authority provided by the Arms Export Control Act
6 (22 U.S.C. 2751 et seq.) to the Government of Hungary,
7 or to any agency or instrumentality of Hungary, unless
8 the President submits to the relevant congressional com-
9 mittees a certification that the Government of Hungary
10 is not taking actions to undermine democratic, security,
11 intelligence, or law enforcement institutions in Hungary
12 in a manner that hinders United States-Hungary collabo-
13 ration and cooperation.

14 (b) WAIVER.—The President may waive the restric-
15 tion in subsection (a) if the President—

16 (1) determines that such a waiver is in the na-
17 tional interest of the United States; and

18 (2) submits to the relevant congressional com-
19 mittees a report detailing—

1 (A) any actions taken by the Government
2 of Hungary that undermine democratic, secu-
3 rity, intelligence, or law enforcement institu-
4 tions in Hungary in a manner that hinders
5 United States-Hungary collaboration and co-
6 operation;

7 (B) Russian influence in Hungary that
8 hinders United States-Hungary collaboration
9 and cooperation;

10 (C) a description of actions by which the
11 Government of Hungary is resisting, opposing,
12 or undermining United States-, European
13 Union- or North Atlantic Treaty Organization-
14 led efforts to support Ukraine;

15 (D) the Government of Hungary's imple-
16 mentation or lack thereof of European Union
17 sanctions on Russian entities, individuals, or ac-
18 counts; and

19 (E) any failure to provide defense articles
20 or services previously pledged or announced by
21 the Government of Hungary to Ukraine.

22 (c) RELEVANT CONGRESSIONAL COMMITTEES DE-
23 FINED.—In this section, the term “relevant congressional
24 committees” means—

25 (1) the congressional defense committees; and

1 (2) the Committee on Foreign Relations of the
2 Senate and the Committee on Foreign Affairs of the
3 House of Representatives.
