

AMENDMENT TO RULES COMM. PRINT 118–36
OFFERED BY MR. CONNOLLY OF VIRGINIA

At the end of subtitle C of title XVII, add the following:

1 **SEC. __. EXPORT LIMITATIONS RELATED TO THE GOVERN-**
2 **MENT OF HUNGARY.**

3 (a) IN GENERAL.—The President may not sell or au-
4 thorize a license for the export of defense articles pursuant
5 to any authority provided by the Arms Export Control Act
6 (22 U.S.C. 2751 et seq.) to the Government of Hungary,
7 or to any agency or instrumentality of Hungary, unless
8 the President transmits to the appropriate congressional
9 committees a certification that the Government of Hun-
10 gary is not engaged in security collaboration with the Gov-
11 ernments of the People’s Republic of China, the Russian
12 Federation, or the Islamic Republic of Iran in a manner
13 that threatens the national security interests of the United
14 States or substantially undermines United States-Hun-
15 gary security cooperation.

16 (b) WAIVER.—The President may waive the restric-
17 tion under subsection (a) if the President determines that
18 such a waiver is in the national security interest of the
19 United States.

1 (c) REPORT.—A waiver described in subsection (b)
2 may only take effect if the President submits to the appro-
3 priate congressional committees a report detailing—

4 (1) any actions taken by the Government of
5 Hungary to engage in security collaboration with the
6 Governments of the People’s Republic of China, the
7 Russian Federation, or the Islamic Republic of Iran;

8 (2) how such collaboration threatens the na-
9 tional security interests of the United States or sub-
10 stantially undermines United States-Hungary secu-
11 rity cooperation; and

12 (3) efforts of the Government of Hungary to re-
13 sist, oppose, or undermine United States-, European
14 Union-, or North Atlantic Treaty Organization-led
15 efforts to combat the malign influence of the Peo-
16 ple’s Republic of China, the Russian Federation, or
17 the Islamic Republic of Iran.

18 (d) DEFINITION.—In this section, the term “appro-
19 priate congressional committees” means—

20 (1) the congressional defense committees; and

21 (2) the Committee on Foreign Affairs of the
22 House of Representatives and the Committee on
23 Foreign Relations of the Senate.
