1 **TITLE _____—HONOR OUR**
2 **COMMITMENT**

3 **SEC. __01. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This title may be cited as the “Honor Our Commit-
5 ment Act of 2026”.

6 **SEC. __02. LIMITATION ON THE DETENTION AND REMOVAL**
7 **OF NATIONALS OF VIETNAM.**

8 (a) **LIMITATION ON DETENTION AND REMOVAL.—**

9 Except as provided in subsection (b), an alien may not
10 be detained or removed from the United States on or after
11 the date of enactment of this title if the alien—

12 (1) is a national of Vietnam;

13 (2) entered the United States on or before July
14 12, 1995 and has continuously resided in the United
15 States since such entry; and

16 (3) is subject to a final order of removal.

17 (b) **EXCEPTION.—**Subsection (a) shall not apply to
18 an alien if—

19 (1) the Secretary of Homeland Security deter-
20 mines, based on credible facts, that the alien is di-

1 rectly responsible for harming the security of the
2 United States; or

3 (2) the alien is subject to extradition.

4 (c) EMPLOYMENT AUTHORIZATION.—The Secretary
5 of Homeland Security shall authorize an alien described
6 in subsection (a) to engage in employment in the United
7 States and provide such alien with an “employment au-
8 thorized” endorsement or other appropriate work permit.

9 **SEC. _03. NOTICE FOR CERTAIN VIETNAMESE NATIONALS**
10 **WITH REMOVAL ORDERS.**

11 (a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 60 days after the
12 date of enactment of this title, the Secretary of Homeland
13 Security shall provide notice of the provisions of this title
14 to each alien described in section 2(a).

15 (b) CONTENTS OF NOTICE.—The notice described in
16 subsection (a) shall include information explaining the re-
17 quirements and instructions for filing a motion to reopen
18 removal proceedings under section 240(c)(7) of the Immi-
19 gration and Nationality Act (8 U.S.C. 1229a(c)(7)).

20 **SEC. _04. JUDICIAL REVIEW.**

21 (a) REVIEW.—Notwithstanding any other provision
22 of law, an individual or entity who has been harmed by
23 a violation of this title may file an action in an appropriate
24 district court of the United States to seek declaratory or
25 injunctive relief.

1 (b) RULE OF CONSTRUCTION.—Nothing in this title
2 may be construed to preclude an action filed pursuant to
3 subsection (a) from proceeding as a class action (as such
4 term is defined in section 1711 of title 28, United States
5 Code).
