

**AMENDMENT TO**  
**RULES COMMITTEE PRINT 118–13**  
**OFFERED BY MR. CRENSHAW OF TEXAS**

At the end of the bill (before the short title), insert the following:

1       SEC. \_\_\_\_\_. (a) IN GENERAL.—None of the funds  
2 made available for the Children’s Hospitals Graduate  
3 Medical Education Payment program by this Act may be  
4 used, either directly or indirectly, by hospitals that furnish  
5 hospitals that furnish specified procedures and drugs (as  
6 defined in subsection (c)) to an individual under 18 years  
7 of age.

8       (b) RULE OF CONSTRUCTION.—Nothing in this sec-  
9 tion be construed as prohibiting payments to a hospital  
10 that furnishes mental or behavioral health services to indi-  
11 viduals under 18 years of age for the treatment of gender  
12 dysphoria not consisting of specified procedures and  
13 drugs.

14       (c) SPECIFIED PROCEDURES AND DRUGS.—

15           (1) IN GENERAL.—Except as provided in para-  
16 graph (2), the term “specified procedures and  
17 drugs” means, with respect to an individual, any of  
18 the following:

1 (A) Performing any surgery for the pur-  
2 pose of changing the body of such individual to  
3 no longer correspond to the individual's sex, in-  
4 cluding—

- 5 (i) castration;
- 6 (ii) orchiectomy;
- 7 (iii) scrotoplasty;
- 8 (iv) vasectomy;
- 9 (v) hysterectomy;
- 10 (vi) oophorectomy;
- 11 (vii) ovariectomy;
- 12 (viii) metoidioplasty;
- 13 (ix) penectomy;
- 14 (x) phalloplasty;
- 15 (xi) vaginoplasty;
- 16 (xii) vaginectomy;
- 17 (xiii) vulvoplasty;
- 18 (xiv) reduction thyrochondroplasty;
- 19 (xv) chondrolaryngoplasty, or any  
20 plastic surgery that feminizes or  
21 masculinizes the facial features for such  
22 purpose;
- 23 (xvi) mastectomy, or any placement of  
24 chest implants to create feminine breasts  
25 for such purpose; or

1 (xvii) any placement of fat or artificial  
2 implants in the gluteal region for such pur-  
3 pose.

4 (B) Administering, supplying, prescribing,  
5 dispensing, distributing, or otherwise conveying  
6 to an individual medications for the purpose de-  
7 scribed in subparagraph (A), including—

8 (i) gonadotrophin releasing hormone  
9 analogues or other puberty-blocking drugs  
10 to stop or delay normal puberty; and

11 (ii) estrogen, testosterone, progester-  
12 one, or other androgens in an amount  
13 greater than would normally be produced  
14 endogenously in a healthy individual of the  
15 individual's age and sex.

16 (2) EXCEPTION.—Paragraph (1) shall not  
17 apply to the provision by a physician or health care  
18 provider, with the consent of the child's parent or  
19 legal guardian, of—

20 (A) puberty suppression or blocking pre-  
21 scription drugs for the purpose of normalizing  
22 puberty for a minor experiencing precocious pu-  
23 berty;

24 (B) appropriate and medically necessary  
25 procedures or treatments to correct for—

1 (i) a medically verifiable genetic dis-  
2 order of sex development, including—

3 (I) 46 XX chromosomes with  
4 virilization;

5 (II) 46 XY chromosomes with  
6 under virilization; or

7 (III) both ovarian and testicular  
8 tissue; or

9 (ii) sex chromosome structure, sex  
10 steroid hormone production, or sex hor-  
11 mone action, if determined to be abnormal  
12 by a physician through genetic or bio-  
13 chemical testing;

14 (C) infection, disease, injury, or disorder  
15 caused or exacerbated by the previous medical  
16 procedures; or

17 (D) a physical disorder, physical injury, or  
18 physical illness that would, as certified by a  
19 physician, place the individual in imminent dan-  
20 ger of death or impairment of a major bodily  
21 function unless the procedure is performed, not  
22 including if the procedure or drug is for the  
23 purpose described in paragraph (1)(A).

24 (3) SEX.—For purposes of paragraph (1), the  
25 term “sex”—

1           (A) means the indication of male or female  
2 sex by reproductive potential or capacity, sex  
3 chromosomes, naturally occurring sex hor-  
4 mones, gonads, or internal or external genitalia  
5 present at birth; and

6           (B) does not include a subjective percep-  
7 tion of sex or gender.
