| 4  | (1) On February 23, 1971, Corporal Gary An-          |
| 5  | drew Cyr was 19 years old.                           |
| 6  | (2) Corporal Cyr was assigned to the 10th            |
| 7  | Pathfinder Detachment in May of 1970 and served      |
| 8  | as a Special Operations Pathfinder until January     |
| 9  | 1972.                                                |
| 10 | (3) In February 1971, Corporal Cyr's Path-           |
| 11 | finder Unit was tasked with supporting Operation     |
| 12 | Dak Soo Ri 71–1, a joint operation with Korean in-   |
| 13 | fantry units.                                        |
| 14 | (4) On February 23, 1971, Corporal Cyr was           |
| 15 | the Pathfinder air traffic controller and cargo      |
| 16 | loadmaster for four flights and twelve landing pick- |
| 17 | up zones for the Operation, including the primary    |
| 18 | insertion point.                                     |

| 1  | (5) This Operation involved the insertion of          |

| 2  | over 1,000 Korean soldiers from two divisions and     |
| 3  | 31 sling loads of cargo transported by 35 helicopters |
| 4  | over the course of the evening of February 23, 1971.  |
| 5  | (6) Corporal Cyr was responsible for coordi-          |
| 6  | nating incoming helicopter flights and providing ac-  |
| 7  | curate on-the-ground information to the pilots, es-   |
| 8  | sentially operating as a one-man air traffic control  |
| 9  | tower inside a combat zone.                           |
| 10 | (7) Corporal Cyr's leadership and execution en-       |
| 11 | abled the mission to be completed in a minimum        |
| 12 | time period with no damaged cargo or casualties.      |
| 13 | (8) Corporal Cyr's actions were hailed by heli-       |
| 14 | copter pilots and officers from the inserting battal- |
| 15 | ions.                                                 |
| 16 | (9) Corporal Cyr's actions on February 23 epit-       |
| 17 | omized the Pathfinder motto of "First in, Last        |
| 18 | out,".                                                |
| 19 | (10) William P. Murphy, Commander of the              |
| 20 | 10th Pathfinder Detachment, submitted a rec-          |
| 21 | ommendation for the award of a Bronze Star to Cor-    |
| 22 | poral Cyr to 10th Combat Aviation Battalion Com-      |
| 23 | mander, Captain Charles E. Markham.                   |
| 24 | (11) Captain Markham approved the rec-                |
| 25 | ommendation and submitted it to 17th Aviation         |

| 3  | (12) Lieutenant Colonel Walker approved the        |
| 4  | recommendation.                                    |
| 5  | (13) The 10th Pathfinder Detachment began to       |
| 6  | stand down in December 1971 and deactivated in     |
| 7  | January 1972, before Corporal Cyr could be award-  |
| 8  | ed the Bronze Star.                                |
| 9  | (14) Corporal Cyr's initial award was lost as a    |
| 10 | result of the deactivation.                        |
| 11 | (b) Purpose.—That the House of Representatives—    |
| 12 | (1) honors the heroism of Corporal Gary An-        |
| 13 | drew Cyr to successfully insert troops and ammuni- |
| 14 | tion on time and on target; and                    |
| 15 | (2) believes the United States Army, in light of   |
| 16 | new information, should consider revisiting deco-  |
| 17 | rating and honoring the courage and leadership of  |
| 18 | Corporal Gary Andrew Cyr.                          |
