

**AMENDMENT TO**  
**RULES COMMITTEE PRINT 119-33**  
**OFFERED BY MR. DAVIS OF NORTH CAROLINA**

Add at the end of subtitle B of title XVI the following new section:

1 **SEC. 16\_\_.** **PUBLICLY AVAILABLE INFORMATION AND**  
2 **OPEN-SOURCE INTELLIGENCE LAYER FOR IN-**  
3 **TEGRATION INTO THE ARMY DIGITAL INTEL-**  
4 **LIGENCE ENTERPRISE.**

5 (a) PROGRAM.—

6 (1) REQUIREMENT.—The Secretary of the  
7 Army, acting through the Army Open-Source Intel-  
8 ligence Office within the Office of the Deputy Chief  
9 of Staff for Intelligence and executed in coordination  
10 with the Program Executive Office for Intelligence,  
11 Electronic Warfare, and Sensors, may carry out a  
12 program to integrate publicly available information,  
13 open-source intelligence, and commercially available  
14 information into the intelligence systems and ana-  
15 lytic environments of the Army.

16 (2) ELEMENTS.—The Secretary shall ensure  
17 that the program under paragraph (1)—

1 (A) supports the design and implementa-  
2 tion of data pipelines and frameworks capable  
3 of fusing unclassified and classified intelligence  
4 data for operational and analytical use;

5 (B) establishes interoperability standards,  
6 common data models, and security protocols for  
7 ingesting open-source intelligence and commer-  
8 cially available information within the analytic  
9 platforms of the Army and joint analytic plat-  
10 forms; and

11 (C) incorporates artificial intelligence and  
12 machine learning tools to enhance data exploi-  
13 tation, visualization, and decision support.

14 (b) COORDINATION.—The Secretary shall coordinate  
15 activities under subsection (a) with—

16 (1) the Office of the Under Secretary of De-  
17 fense for Intelligence and Security;

18 (2) the Directorate for Intelligence of the Joint  
19 Chiefs of Staff;

20 (3) the Defense Intelligence Agency; and

21 (4) other intelligence components as appro-  
22 priate to ensure interoperability, security, and com-  
23 pliance with data governance policies.

24 (c) FUNDING AUTHORIZATION.—

1           (1) INCREASE.—Notwithstanding the amounts  
2           set forth in the funding tables in division D, the  
3           amount authorized to be appropriated in section 201  
4           for operations and maintenance, Army, as specified  
5           in the corresponding funding table in section 4201,  
6           for other service support, Line 470, is hereby in-  
7           creased by \$5,000,000 (with the amount of such in-  
8           crease to be used to support the program under sub-  
9           section (c)).

10           (2) OFFSET.—Notwithstanding the amounts set  
11           forth in the funding tables in division D, the amount  
12           authorized to be appropriated in section 301 for pro-  
13           curement, Defense-Wide, as specified in the cor-  
14           responding funding table in section 4101, for Chem-  
15           ical Biological Situational Awareness, Line 072, is  
16           hereby reduced by \$5,000,000.

17           (d) REPORTS.—Not later than 180 days after the  
18           date of the enactment of this Act, and annually thereafter  
19           through fiscal year 2029, the Secretary shall submit to  
20           the congressional defense committees a report detailing—

21           (1) progress on integration of open-source intel-  
22           ligence, publicly available information, and commer-  
23           cially available information into the intelligence and  
24           analytic environments of the Army;

1           (2) measurable improvements to decision  
2           timelines, targeting accuracy, and data fusion per-  
3           formance; and

4           (3) recommendations for expanding successful  
5           integration models to other Armed Forces or joint  
6           programs.

7           (e) DURATION.—The authority to carry out this sec-  
8           tion shall terminate on October 1, 2029.
