

**AMENDMENT TO H.R. 754, AS REPORTED
OFFERED BY MR. DENT OF PENNSYLVANIA**

At the end of the bill, add the following new title:

1 **TITLE V—OTHER MATTERS**

2 **SEC. 501. REVIEW OF CITIZENSHIP OF PERSONS ENGAGED**
3 **IN TERRORIST ACTIVITIES.**

4 (a) REVIEW.—The Secretary of State, in consultation
5 with the Director of National Intelligence, shall periodi-
6 cally review whether a United States citizen is an
7 unprivileged enemy belligerent (as defined in section
8 948a(7) of title 10, United States Code) engaging in or
9 supporting hostilities against the United States or allies
10 of the United States.

11 (b) **REBUTTABLE PRESUMPTION AGAINST**
12 **UNPRIVILEGED ENEMY BELLIGERENTS.**—If upon a re-
13 view under subsection (a) the Secretary determines that
14 a United States citizen is an unprivileged enemy bellig-
15 erent living outside the United States, there shall be a re-
16 buttable presumption that the person has voluntarily re-
17 nounced United States citizenship in accordance with sec-
18 tion 349 of the Immigration and Nationality Act (8 U.S.C.
19 1481) and the Secretary may issue, approve, and forward
20 a certification of loss of United States nationality with re-

1 spect to such person in accordance with section 358 of
2 such Act (8 U.S.C. 1501).

3 (c) LOSS OF NATIONALITY BY UNPRIVILEGED
4 ENEMY BELLIGERENTS.—Section 349(a) of the Immigra-
5 tion and Nationality Act (8 U.S.C. 1481(a)) is amended—

6 (1) in paragraphs (1) through (6), by striking
7 “or” at the end;

8 (2) in paragraph (7), by striking the period at
9 the end and inserting “; or”; and

10 (3) by adding at the end the following:

11 “(8) being an unprivileged enemy belligerent (as de-
12 fined in section 948a(7) of title 10, United States Code).”.
