## 2 Congress finds the following: (1) That calls to "defund", "disband", "dis-3 4 mantle", or "abolish" the police should be con-5 demned and rule of law should be strictly maintained. 6 (2) Local law enforcement officers take an oath 7 to never betray the public trust. 8 9 (3) In the course of investigations into officers 10 who have allegedly exhibited misconduct, local law 11 enforcement should have certain rights to ensure a 12 fair administration of justice, including— 13 (A) a local law enforcement officer's inher-14 ent right to self-defense against physical 15 threats; 16 (B) a local law enforcement officer's right

to legal recourse if a civilian attempts to assault

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the officer;

1	(C) a local law enforcement officer's right
2	to be protected from physical harassment tar-
3	geting the officer;
4	(D) a local law enforcement officer's right
5	to equipment necessary for personal protection;
6	(E) a local law enforcement officer's right
7	to counsel or a representative present at any
8	interview conducted as part of an investigation;
9	(F) a local law enforcement officer's right
10	to be informed of the nature of the investiga-
11	tion before any interview commences, including
12	the name of the complainant and sufficient in-
13	formation to reasonably apprise the officer of

18	(i) to not be subjected to any offensive

23	motional inducement;
24	(H) a local law enforcement officer's right
25	to a hearing, with notification in advance of the

1	date, access to transcripts, other relevant docu-

3	(I) a local law enforcement officer's right
4	to have the opportunity to respond to adverse
5	accusations; and
6	(J) a local law enforcement officer's right
7	to not be disciplined for exercising a Fifth
8	Amendment right to remain silent unless grant-
9	ed immunity that such statements will not be
10	used against the officer in any criminal pro-
11	ceeding.
12	(4) In order to ensure these investigations are
13	conducted in a manner that protects the public, re-
14	spects the rights of local law enforcement personnel,

7	SEC. 3. SENSE OF CONGRESS.
8	It is the sense of Congress that:
9	(1) Local law enforcement agencies and officers
10	shall be recognized for their tireless work to protect
11	us and make our communities safer.
12	(2) Calls to "defund", "disband", "dismantle",
13	or "abolish" the police shall be condemned;.
14	(3) Dialogue between local law enforcement and
15	their respective communities shall be encouraged to
16	improve public safety, and engage all of society's
17	stakeholders.
18	(4) The rights of police officers to carry out
19	their duties to protect our communities with integ-
20	rity and to have essential protections during the
21	course of an investigation shall be respected.
