

AMENDMENT TO RULES COMMITTEE PRINT

OFFERED BY MR. DONALDS OF FLORIDA

At the end of title VIII, add the following:

1 **SEC. ____ . ADVANCED TECHNOLOGY VEHICLES MANUFAC-**
2 **TURING INCENTIVE PROGRAM.**

3 Section 136 of the Energy Independence and Security
4 Act of 2007 (42 U.S.C. 17013) is amended—

5 (1) in subsection (a)—

6 (A) in paragraph (1)—

7 (i) in subparagraph (E) by striking
8 “and”;

9 (ii) in subparagraph (F) by striking
10 the period and inserting “; and”; and

11 (iii) by adding at the end the fol-
12 lowing:

13 “(F) an unmanned aircraft system; and

14 “(G) advanced air mobility technology.”;

15 and

16 (B) by adding at the end the following:

17 “(6) **ADVANCED AIR MOBILITY TECHNOLOGY.**—

18 The term ‘advanced air mobility technology’ means
19 a transportation system that transports people and

1 property by air between two points in the United
2 States using aircraft with advanced technologies, in-
3 cluding electric aircraft or electric vertical take-off
4 and landing aircraft, in both controlled and uncon-
5 trolled airspace.

6 “(7) UNMANNED AIRCRAFT SYSTEM.—The term
7 ‘unmanned aircraft system’ means an unmanned air-
8 craft and associated elements (including communica-
9 tion links and the components that control the un-
10 manned aircraft) that are required for the operator
11 to operate safely and efficiently in the national air-
12 space system.”; and

13 (2) by inserting after subsection (k) the fol-
14 lowing:

15 “(1) SPECIAL RULES FOR ADVANCED AIR MOBILITY
16 TECHNOLOGY AND UNMANNED AIRCRAFT SYSTEMS.—

17 “(1) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary may only
18 provide loans under this section to eligible entities
19 for the production of advanced air mobility tech-
20 nology and unmanned aircraft systems in the United
21 States if such entities are not covered foreign enti-
22 ties or are not domiciled in covered foreign coun-
23 tries.

24 “(2) SET ASIDE.—Of the amount of funds that
25 are used to provide awards for each fiscal year

1 under subsection (b), the Secretary shall use
2 \$3,000,000,000 to provide awards to eligible entities
3 to produce advanced air mobility technology and un-
4 manned aircraft systems.

5 “(3) DEFINITIONS.—In this subsection:

6 “(A) COVERED FOREIGN COUNTRY.—The
7 term ‘covered foreign country’ means a country
8 that—

9 “(i) the intelligence community has
10 identified as a foreign adversary in its
11 most recent Annual Threat Assessment; or

12 “(ii) the Secretary of Homeland Secu-
13 rity, in coordination with the Director of
14 National Intelligence, has identified as a
15 foreign adversary that is not included in
16 such Annual Threat Assessment.

17 “(B) COVERED FOREIGN ENTITY.—The
18 term ‘covered foreign entity’ means an entity—

19 “(i) included on the Consolidated
20 Screening List or Entity List as des-
21 ignated by the Secretary of Commerce;

22 “(ii) domiciled in the People’s Repub-
23 lic of China or the Russian Federation;

1 “(iii) subject to influence or control by
2 the government of the People’s Republic of
3 China or by the Russian Federation; or

4 “(iv) that is a subsidiary or affiliate
5 of an entity described in clauses (i)
6 through (iii).”.
