

AMENDMENT TO RULES COMM. PRINT 119-8
OFFERED BY MR. DUNN OF FLORIDA

At the end of subtitle B of title XIII, add the following section:

1 **SEC. 13 ____ . ANNUAL REPORT ON PRESENCE AND ACTIVI-**
2 **TIES OF EUROPEAN UNION AND NATO MILI-**
3 **TARIES IN THE INDO-PACIFIC REGION.**

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 180 days after the
5 date of the enactment of this Act, and annually thereafter,
6 the Commander of United States Indo-Pacific Command,
7 in coordination with the Commander of United States Eu-
8 ropean Command, shall submit to the congressional de-
9 fense committees a comprehensive report on the military
10 presence and activities of European Union and NATO
11 member countries in the Indo-Pacific region, that also in-
12 cludes—

13 (1) the best available estimate, over the course
14 of the preceding year, of the sum of—

15 (A) the number of land, maritime, and air
16 personnel of the United States Armed Forces,
17 who are working jointly with

18 (B) the reported number of personnel from
19 European Union and NATO-member militaries

1 operating in or deployed to the Indo-Pacific re-
2 gion; and

3 (2) an analysis of how the presence of the mili-
4 taries of such countries in the Indo-Pacific region
5 contributes to deterrence against Chinese aggression,
6 including a discussion of posture, capability, multi-
7 lateral operations, and strategic signaling effects.

8 (b) CRITERIA.—Each report required under sub-
9 section (a) shall include, with respect to each military of
10 a member country of the European Union or NATO with
11 a presence in the Indo-Pacific region, the following:

12 (1) An estimate of the percentage of each mili-
13 tary's total forces, disaggregated by service branch
14 (land, maritime, air), that are typically deployed,
15 stationed, or otherwise present in the Indo-Pacific
16 region on an annual basis.

17 (2) Types and frequency of military activities,
18 such as maritime patrols, joint training exercises,
19 port visits, freedom of navigation operations, and
20 other relevant operations conducted in the Indo-Pa-
21 cific region.

22 (3) Identification and assessment of the specific
23 offensive, defensive, and logistics capabilities de-
24 ployed or maintained by each military in the region,
25 including platforms, systems, and infrastructure.

1 (4) An analysis of how the military presence
2 and capabilities of each military complement en-
3 hances or increases United States military readiness
4 and capabilities in the Indo-Pacific region.
