

**AMENDMENT IN THE NATURE OF A SUBSTITUTE
TO H.R. 910
OFFERED BY MR. DOYLE OF PENNSYLVANIA**

— Mr. Ryan of Ohio, Mr. Inslee of Washington

Strike all after the enacting clause and insert the following:

**1 SECTION 1. STUDY ON EFFECT OF EPA CLIMATE CHANGE
2 REGULATIONS ON INTERNATIONAL COMPETI-
3 TIVENESS OF UNITED STATES PRODUCERS
4 OF ENERGY-INTENSIVE PRODUCTS.**

5 (a) STUDY.—Not later than 1 year after the date of
6 the enactment of this Act, the Administrator of the Envi-
7 ronmental Protection Agency shall—

8 (1) conduct a study to determine, with respect
9 to the period beginning on such date of enactment
10 and ending on December 31, 2016, the extent to
11 which the regulations of the Environmental Protec-
12 tion Agency under the Clean Air Act to address cli-
13 mate change (including any such regulations pro-
14 jected by the Administrator to be promulgated)
15 will—

16 (A) cause greenhouse gas leakage; and

1 (B) reduce the international competitive-
2 ness of United States producers of energy-in-
3 tensive products; and

4 (2) submit a report on the results of the study
5 to the Congress, including recommendations for leg-
6 islative, administrative, or other actions to miti-
7 gate—

8 (A) any greenhouse gas leakage identified
9 pursuant to paragraph (1)(A); and

10 (B) any reduction in international competi-
11 tiveness identified pursuant to paragraph
12 (1)(B).

13 (b) DEFINITIONS.—In this section:

14 (1) The term “energy-intensive product”
15 means—

16 (A) iron, steel, aluminum, cement, bulk
17 glass, paper and pulp, chemicals, or industrial
18 ceramics; or

19 (B) any other manufactured product which
20 the Administrator of the Environmental Protec-
21 tion Agency determines—

22 (I) is sold in bulk for purposes of fur-
23 ther manufacture; and

24 (ii) generates, in the course of the
25 manufacture of the product, direct and in-

1 direct greenhouse gas emissions that are
2 comparable (on an emissions-per-dollar
3 basis) to emissions generated in the manu-
4 facture or production of products identified
5 in subparagraph (A).

6 (2) The term “greenhouse gas leakage” means
7 an increase in greenhouse gas emissions abroad be-
8 cause of the movement of the production of eco-
9 nomic goods from the United States to other coun-
10 tries.
