

**AMENDMENT TO RULES COMMITTEE PRINT 119-**

**OFFERED BY MS. ESCOBAR OF TEXAS**

Add at the end of subtitle B of title XVII the following new section:

1 **SEC. 17\_\_\_. REPORT ON USE OF MILITARY INSTALLATIONS**  
2 **FOR ICE FACILITIES.**

3 (a) REPORT.—Not later than 120 days after the date  
4 of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary of Defense  
5 shall submit to the congressional defense committees a re-  
6 port assessing the readiness, resource, infrastructure, and  
7 cost implications to the Department of Defense with re-  
8 spect to the use of military installations for U.S. Immigra-  
9 tion and Customs Enforcement facilities.

10 (b) ELEMENTS.—The report under subsection (a)  
11 shall include the following:

12 (1) An inventory of all military installations  
13 currently supporting U.S. Immigration and Customs  
14 Enforcement detention or processing facilities, in-  
15 cluding the scope, duration, legal authorities for  
16 such use, and all support, services, personnel, secu-  
17 rity requirements, and infrastructure provided by  
18 the host installation.

1           (2) A list of any military installations under  
2           consideration for future use for such purposes by  
3           any component, agency, or organization within the  
4           Department of Homeland Security.

5           (3) An accounting of all direct and indirect  
6           costs incurred by the Department of Defense in sup-  
7           porting such facilities, including impacts to oper-  
8           ations and maintenance accounts, deferred mainte-  
9           nance, personnel costs, and any reimbursements re-  
10          ceived.

11          (4) A quantitative assessment of impacts on  
12          military readiness, including training opportunities  
13          lost or reduced, personnel diverted from military du-  
14          ties, impacts on unit training schedules, deployment  
15          preparation, operational availability, installation ca-  
16          pacity, and any resulting mission tradeoffs.

17          (5) A description of any infrastructure modi-  
18          fications, facility degradation, deferred maintenance  
19          requirements, or diversion of facilities from military  
20          purposes associated with such use.

21          (6) A description of any military construction  
22          projects, facility sustainment activities, maintenance  
23          requirements, work orders, training activities, or  
24          other installation priorities that were delayed, modi-

1       fied, reduced in scope, or cancelled as a result of  
2       supporting detention or processing facilities.

3           (7) An assessment of impacts on members of  
4       the Armed Forces, military families, and installation  
5       communities, including effects on housing avail-  
6       ability, childcare capacity, medical services, morale,  
7       quality of life programs, and access to installation  
8       services.

9           (8) An assessment of whether full reimburse-  
10      ment was provided by the Department of Homeland  
11      Security for all costs incurred by the Department of  
12      Defense and identification of any unreimbursed  
13      costs.
