Add at the end the following:

1	SEC. 702. RESOURCES FOR VICTIMS OF GUN VIOLENCE
2	ACT.
3	(a) Definitions.—In this section:
4	(1) Advisory Council.—The term "Advisory
5	Council" means the Advisory Council to Support
6	Victims of Gun Violence established under sub-
7	section (b).
8	(2) APPROPRIATE COMMITTEES.—The term
9	"appropriate committees" means the following:
10	(A) The Committee on Health, Education,
11	Labor, and Pensions of the Senate.
12	(B) The Committee on the Judiciary of the
13	Senate.
14	(C) The Committee on Education and
15	Labor of the House of Representatives.
16	(D) The Committee on Energy and Com-
17	merce of the House of Representatives.
18	(E) The Committee on the Judiciary of the
19	House of Representatives.

1	(F) Any other relevant committee of the
2	Senate or of the House of Representatives with
3	jurisdiction over matters affecting victims of
4	gun violence.
5	(3) Gun violence.—The term "gun violence"
6	means—
7	(A) suicide involving firearms;
8	(B) homicide involving firearms;
9	(C) domestic violence involving firearms;
10	(D) hate crimes involving firearms;
11	(E) youth violence involving firearms;
12	(F) mass shootings;
13	(G) unintentional shootings;
14	(H) non-fatal shootings; and
15	(I) threats or exposure to violent acts in-
16	volving firearms.
17	(4) VICTIM ASSISTANCE PROFESSIONAL.—The
18	term "victim assistance professional" means a pro-
19	fessional who assists victims of gun violence, includ-
20	ing—
21	(A) a medical professional, including an
22	emergency medical professional;
23	(B) a social worker;
24	(C) a provider of long-term services or
25	care; and

1	(D) a victim advocate.
2	(5) VICTIM OF GUN VIOLENCE.—The term "vic-
3	tim of gun violence" means—
4	(A) an individual who has been wounded
5	as a result of gun violence;
6	(B) an individual who has been threatened
7	with an act of gun violence;
8	(C) an individual who has witnessed an act
9	of gun violence; and
10	(D) a relative, classmate, coworker, or
11	other associate of—
12	(i) an individual who has been killed
13	as a result of gun violence; or
14	(ii) an individual described in sub-
15	paragraph (A) or (B).
16	(b) Advisory Council to Support Victims of
17	GUN VIOLENCE.—
18	(1) Establishment.—There is established an
19	Advisory Council to Support Victims of Gun Vio-
20	lence.
21	(2) Membership.—
22	(A) In General.—The Advisory Council
23	shall be composed of the following members or
24	their designees:

1	(i) The Secretary of Health and
2	Human Services.
3	(ii) The Attorney General.
4	(iii) The Secretary of Education.
5	(iv) The Commissioner of the Social
6	Security Administration.
7	(v) As appropriate, the head of any
8	other Federal department or agency identi-
9	fied by the Secretary of Health and
10	Human Services as having responsibilities,
11	or administering programs, relating to
12	issues affecting victims of gun violence.
13	(B) Additional members.—In addition
14	to the members described in subparagraph (A),
15	the Advisory Council shall be composed of the
16	following:
17	(i) Not fewer than 2 and not more
18	than 5 victims of gun violence, who shall
19	be appointed by the Secretary of Health
20	and Human Services.
21	(ii) Not fewer than 2 and not more
22	than 5 victim assistance professionals, who
23	shall be appointed by the Secretary of
24	Health and Human Services.

1	(C) Lead agency.—The Department of
2	Health and Human Services shall be the lead
3	agency for the Advisory Council.
4	(3) Duties.—
5	(A) Assessment.—The Advisory Council
6	shall—
7	(i) survey victims of gun violence and
8	victim assistance professionals about their
9	needs in order to inform the content of in-
10	formation disseminated under subpara-
11	graph (B) and the report published under
12	subparagraph (C);
13	(ii) conduct a literature review and as-
14	sess past or ongoing programs designed to
15	assist victims of gun violence or individuals
16	with similar needs to determine—
17	(I) the effectiveness of the pro-
18	grams; and
19	(II) best and promising practices
20	for assisting victims of gun violence;
21	and
22	(iii) assess the administration of com-
23	pensation funds established after mass
24	shootings to determine best and promising

1	practices to direct victims of gun violence
2	to sources of funding.
3	(B) Information.—
4	(i) In General.—The Advisory
5	Council shall identify, promote, coordinate,
6	and disseminate to the public information,
7	resources, and best and promising prac-
8	tices available to help victims of gun vio-
9	lence—
10	(I) meet their medical, financial,
11	educational, workplace, housing,
12	transportation, assistive technology,
13	and accessibility needs;
14	(II) maintain their mental health
15	and emotional well-being;
16	(III) seek legal redress for their
17	injuries and protection against any
18	ongoing threats to their safety; and
19	(IV) access government pro-
20	grams, services, and benefits for
21	which they may be eligible or to which
22	they may be entitled.
23	(ii) Contact Information.—The
24	Advisory Council shall include in the infor-
25	mation disseminated under clause (i) the

1	websites and telephone contact information
2	for helplines of relevant Federal agencies,
3	State agencies, and nonprofit organiza-
4	tions.
5	(iii) AVAILABILITY.—The Advisory
6	Council shall make the information de-
7	scribed in subparagraphs (A) and (B)
8	available—
9	(I) online through a public
10	website; and
11	(II) by submitting a hard copy
12	and making available additional hard
13	copies to—
14	(aa) each Member of Con-
15	gress;
16	(bb) each field office of the
17	Social Security Administration;
18	(cc) each State agency that
19	is responsible for administering
20	health and human services, for
21	dissemination to medical facili-
22	ties;
23	(dd) each State agency that
24	is responsible for administering

1	education programs, for dissemi-
2	nation to schools; and
3	(ee) the office of each State
4	attorney general, for dissemina-
5	tion to local prosecutor's offices.
6	(C) Report.—Not later than 180 days
7	after the date of enactment of this Act, the Ad-
8	visory Council shall—
9	(i) prepare a report that—
10	(I) includes the best and prom-
11	ising practices, resources, and other
12	useful information for victims of gun
13	violence identified under subpara-
14	graph (B);
15	(II) identifies any gaps in items
16	described in subclause (I); and
17	(III) if applicable, identifies any
18	additional Federal or State legislative
19	authority necessary to implement the
20	activities described in subclause (I) or
21	address the gaps described in sub-
22	clause (II);
23	(ii) submit the report prepared under
24	clause (i) to—
25	(I) the appropriate committees;

1	(II) each State agency that is re-
2	sponsible for administering health and
3	human services;
4	(III) each State agency that is
5	responsible for administering edu-
6	cation programs; and
7	(IV) the office of each State at-
8	torney general; and
9	(iii) make the report prepared under
10	clause (i) available to the public online in
11	an accessible format.
12	(D) Public input.—
13	(i) In General.—The Advisory
14	Council shall establish a process to collect
15	public input to inform the development of,
16	and provide updates to, the best and prom-
17	ising practices, resources, and other infor-
18	mation described in subparagraph (B), in-
19	cluding by conducting outreach to entities
20	and individuals described in (clause ii) of
21	this paragraph that—
22	(I) have a range of experience
23	with the types of gun violence de-
24	scribed in subsection (a); and

1	(II) include representation from
2	communities disproportionately af-
3	fected by gun violence.
4	(ii) Entities and individuals.—
5	The entities and individuals described in
6	this subparagraph are—
7	(I) States, local governments,
8	and organizations that provide infor-
9	mation to, or support for, victims of
10	gun violence;
11	(II) victims of gun violence; and
12	(III) victim assistance profes-
13	sionals.
14	(iii) Nature of Outreach.—In con-
15	ducting outreach under clause (i), the Ad-
16	visory Council shall ask for input on—
17	(I) information, resources, and
18	best and promising practices available,
19	including identification of any gaps
20	and unmet needs;
21	(II) recommendations that would
22	help victims of gun violence—
23	(aa) better meet their med-
24	ical, financial, educational, work-
25	place, housing, transportation,

1	assistive technology, and accessi-
2	bility needs;
3	(bb) maintain their mental
4	health and emotional well-being;
5	(cc) seek legal redress for
6	their injuries and protection
7	against any ongoing threats to
8	their safety; and
9	(dd) access government pro-
10	grams, services, and benefits for
11	which the victims may be eligible
12	or to which the victims may be
13	entitled; and
14	(III) any other subject areas dis-
15	covered during the process that would
16	help victims of gun violence.
17	(4) FACA.—The Federal Advisory Committee
18	Act (5 U.S.C. App.) shall not apply to the Advisory
19	Council.
20	(5) Funding.—No additional funds are author-
21	ized to be appropriated to carry out this Act.
22	(6) Sunset.—The Advisory Council shall ter-
23	minate on the date that is 5 years after the date of
24	establishment of the Advisory Council.
