Amendment to H.R. 4909, as Reported Offered by Mr. Fitzpatrick of Pennsylvania

At the end of subtitle G of title V, add the following new sections:

1 SEC. 5____. AUTHORIZATION FOR AWARD OF MEDAL OF 2 HONOR TO RICHARD GRESKO FOR ACTS OF 3 VALOR DURING THE VIETNAM WAR.

4 (a) WAIVER \mathbf{OF} Time LIMITATIONS.—Notwith-5 standing the time limitations specified in section 6248 of 6 title 10, United States Code, or any other time limitation with respect to the awarding of certain medals to persons 7 who served in the Armed Forces, the President may award 8 9 the Medal of Honor under section 6241 of such title to Richard Gresko of Newtown, Pennsylvania, for the acts 10 11 of valor during the Vietnam War described in subsection (b) and for which he was originally awarded the Navy 12 13 Cross.

(b) ACTS OF VALOR DESCRIBED.—The acts of valor
referred to in subsection (a) are the actions of Richard
Gresko in the Republic of Vietnam on the night of March
11–12, 1970, while a lance corporal in the United States
Marine Corps serving in the Third Battalion, Fifth Marine

Regiment, First Marine Division. On that night, Sergeant 1 2 (then Lance Corporal) Gresko was part of an ambush set 3 up to protect a village from enemy attack. Around mid-4 night, his squad ambushed a Viet Cong unit that was attempting to enter the village. During the engagement, Ser-5 geant Gresko observed an enemy hand grenade land near 6 7 his position. With complete disregard for his own personal 8 safety and fully aware of the dangers involved, he 9 unhesitatingly threw himself on top of the grenade, absorbing most of the blast fragments with his own body 10 in order to protect his men from certain injury and pos-11 12 sible death. Although painfully wounded, he continued to 13 direct his men's actions during the engagement.

14 SEC. 5_____. AUTHORIZATION FOR AWARD OF MEDAL OF 15 HONOR TO DAVID A. CHRISTIAN FOR ACTS OF 16 VALOR DURING THE VIETNAM WAR.

17 OF TIME LIMITATIONS.—Notwith-(a) WAIVER standing the time limitations specified in section 3744 of 18 19 title 10, United States Code, or any other time limitation with respect to the awarding of certain medals to persons 20 21 who served in the Armed Forces, the President may award 22 the Medal of Honor under section 3741 of such title to 23 David A. Christian of Washington Crossing, Pennsylvania, 24 for the acts of valor during the Vietnam War described

1 in subsection (b) and for which he was originally awarded2 the Distinguished-Service Cross.

3 (a) ACTS OF VALOR DESCRIBED.—The acts of valor 4 referred to in subsection (a) are the actions of David A. Christian in the Republic of Vietnam on October 29, 1968, 5 while a First Lieutenant serving in the Reconnaissance 6 7 First Battalion, Twenty-Sixth Infantry, First Infantry Di-8 vision. On that day, Lieutenant Christian's team came 9 under heavy and sustained enemy fire while conducting 10 routine operations. Despite sustaining injuries, Lieutenant 11 Christian single handedly assaulted and destroyed an 12 enemy fortification. Over the course of the four-hour engagement, Lieutenant Christian subsequently was seri-13 14 ously wounded, but continued to lead his soldiers and fight 15 off enemy forces. Lieutenant Christian refused treatment of his own serious injuries until all the other wounded sol-16 diers were successfully evacuated. 17
