## AMENDMENT TO RULES COMMITTEE PRINT 118– 36

## OFFERED BY MR. FROST OF FLORIDA

At the end of subtitle B of title XVII, add the following new section:

## 1 SEC. 17\_\_\_\_. INSPECTOR GENERAL OF THE DEPARTMENT 2 OF DEFENSE ANNUAL REPORT ON OVER 3 SIGHT OF FRAUD, WASTE, AND ABUSE.

4 Not later than one year after the date of the enact5 ment of this section, and each fiscal year thereafter, the
6 Inspector General of the Department of Defense shall sub7 mit to Congress and the Comptroller General of the
8 United States, and make publicly available, a report con9 taining, for each fiscal year—

10 (1) a description of the budget of the Depart-11 ment of Defense, the total amount and dollar value 12 of oversight investigations into fraud, waste, and 13 abuse conducted by the Inspector General of the De-14 partment of Defense, and the total amount and dol-15 lar value of oversight investigations into fraud, 16 waste, and abuse conducted by the Inspectors Gen-17 eral of each military department;

(2) statistical tables showing—

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1	(A) the total number and dollar value of
2	oversight investigations completed and pending,
3	set forth separately by type of oversight inves-
4	tigation;
5	(B) the priority given to each type of over-
6	sight investigation;
7	(C) the length of time taken for each type
8	of oversight investigation, from the date of re-
9	ceipt of a qualified incurred cost submission (as
10	such term is defined in section 3842 of title 10,
11	United States Code) and from the date on
12	which the oversight investigation begins;
13	(D) the aggregate cost of performing over-
14	sight investigations, set forth separately by type
15	of oversight investigation; and
16	(E) the total number and dollar value of
17	oversight investigations that are pending for a
18	period longer than one year at the end of the
19	fiscal year covered by the report, and the fiscal
20	year in which the qualified incurred cost sub-
21	mission was received, set forth separately by
22	type of oversight investigation;
23	(3) a summary of any recommendations of ac-
24	tions or resources needed to improve the oversight

25 investigation process; and

(4) any other matters the Inspector General
 considers appropriate.

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
